The Master of Medicine / Surgery Award is a level 9 AQF qualification.

2 ENTRY CRITERIA

2.1 General Criteria

2.2 Additional Entry Requirements / Pre-Requisites

To possess a medical degree from a recognised university which demonstrates the applicant's potential to undertake and complete a research-based study and to be currently engaged in clinical or professional practice.
