**Bachelor of Nursing (3276S)**

**Specific programs/courses recognised for Advanced Standing**

The School of Nursing has articulation arrangements for prospective students who are Enrolled Nurses with the following qualifications:

- Diploma of Nursing (HLT51612 or HLT 51607)
- Certificate IV in Nursing (HLT43407) with medication endorsement
- Certificate IV (HLT43407) without medication endorsement.

In addition to the University General Regulations there are three criteria that form the basis for decisions about Enrolled Nurses and the credit received into the Bachelor of Nursing:

- Recency of practice
- Registration status
- Enrolled Nurse Qualifications

**Recency of Practice**

If the applicant cannot demonstrate the NMBA Recency of practice registration standard they will not be granted credit.

**Registration status**

To be eligible for credit Enrolled Nurses (Div 2) must be registered with NMBA and have no conditions on their registration. In the event an Enrolled Nurse (Div 2) has conditions on their registration the credit granted may need to be modified depending on the conditions imposed by the NMBA.

**Enrolled Nurse Qualifications**

- 1) Enrolled Nurses with a Diploma of Nursing (Enrolled/Division 2 nursing) (HLT51612 or HLT51607) may receive the following credit:

- 2) Enrolled Nurses (Div 2) with Certificate IV in Nursing (HLT43407), who “hold a Board approved qualification in the administration of medications” may receive the following credit:

**Student enrolling for commencement in Semester one 2015 will be required to:**

- **Complete NH1002 Introduction to Public Health Principles in Summer 2016**
- **Overenroll in Semester 2 2015 to complete NB1000 Sociology of Health and Illness**

- 3) Enrolled Nurses (Div 2) with a Certificate IV (HLT43407) who have not completed units of competence in medication management and/or do not hold a Board approved qualification in the administration of medications” will be admitted in the new Bachelor of Nursing (3492).

**Please note**

- Any Enrolled Nurse with the qualification identified in this paper commencing in Semester one 2015 will receive credit as outlined above. They will therefore commence 2nd year in BN (3276S) with some subjects to be completed in summer schools.
- If an Enrolled Nurse has not completed *HLTEN520 Contribute to the care of mothers and babies* they WILL NOT be given credit for *NS1006 Health Across the Lifespan* and they will need to enrol in this unit for the summer term in 2015.
- *NH1002 Public Health Principles* will be offered in summer term 2016 and all Enrolled Nurses commencing in 2015 will have to enrol in this unit for 2016.
- For Enrolled Nurses with a Certificate IV (HLT43407) they will have to over enroll in semester 2 2015 to do NB1000 Sociology of Health and Illness
- Enrolled Nurses commencing in semester 2 2015 will be admitted into the new Bachelor of Nursing (3492) and there are different arrangements for this degree.
- There is also a compulsory EN workshop on the 5th and 6th February 2015 that all Enrolled Nurses must attend.
