3 PURPOSE

These Program Requirements set out the approved requirements for the Graduate Certificate in Pastoral Theology and the Graduate Diploma of Pastoral Theology.

4 OVERVIEW

4.1 Campus Availability

The Graduate Certificate in Applied Pastoral Theology and the Graduate Diploma of Applied Pastoral Theology have been approved for delivery on the Fremantle Campus and the Sydney Campus.

4.2 Student Availability

The Graduate Certificate in Applied Pastoral Theology and the Graduate Diploma of Applied Pastoral Theology are available for enrolment to domestic students only.

4.3 Australian Qualifications Framework

The Graduate Certificate in Applied Pastoral Theology and the Graduate Diploma of Applied Pastoral Theology is accredited by the University as a Level 8 AQF qualification.

4.4 Duration

The Volume of Learning for the Graduate Certificate in Pastoral Theology is 0.5 years of equivalent full-time study.

The Volume of Learning for the Graduate Diploma of Applied Pastoral Theology is 1.0 years of equivalent full-time study.

An option to complete these Programs Part-time is available.

4.5 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Graduate Certificate of Applied Pastoral Theology is three years. The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Graduate Diploma of Applied Pastoral Theology is four years.

4.6 Study Mode

The Graduate Certificate Graduate in Applied Pastoral Theology and the Graduate Diploma of Applied Pastoral Theology are offered in Multimode Study mode.

4.7 Professional Accreditation

There are no professional accreditation requirements applicable to this Program.

5 ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

5.1 University Admission Requirements

7 PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

7.1 Program Description

These unique programs bring together Theology and Counselling, knowledge and skills that are important for pastoral practitioners and chaplains to develop capabilities and competency in the provision of emotional, spiritual support and theological reflection.

Graduates can apply their knowledge of bioethical issues, pastoral theology, and counselling, to establish therapeutic pastoral relationships in practice including facilitation of liturgy and ritual, faith, and belief integration. Students have the opportunity to undertake a practicum placement as an elective and to consolidate their understanding of leadership to begin to think about leadership opportunities.

7.2 Program Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the Graduate Certificate in Applied Pastoral Theology graduates will be able to:

1. Communicate advanced knowledge of the theoretical dimensions of Pastoral Theology;
2. Apply knowledge of bioethical issues, pastoral theology, and counselling to establish therapeutic pastoral relationships in practice;
3. Analyze critically and evaluate complex theological concepts and ethical frameworks, to apply to pastoral encounters;
4. Communicate the significance of applied theology to pastoral practice.

Upon successful completion of the Graduate Diploma of Applied Pastoral Theology graduates will be able to:

1. Communicate advanced knowledge of the theoretical dimensions of Pastoral Theology;
2. Apply knowledge of bioethical issues, pastoral theology, and counselling to establish therapeutic pastoral relationships in practice;
3. Analyze critically and evaluate complex theological concepts and ethical frameworks, to apply to pastoral encounters;
4. Reflect on leadership in ministry by drawing on theoretical knowledge and practical experience.
