3 PURPOSE

These Program Requirements set out the approved requirements for the Graduate Certificate in Wellbeing in Education.

4 OVERVIEW

4.1 Campus Availability

The Graduate Certificate in Wellbeing in Education has been approved for delivery on the Sydney and Fremantle Campuses.

4.2 Student Availability

The Graduate Certificate in Wellbeing in Education is available for enrolment to domestic Students and international Students.

4.3 Australian Qualifications Framework

The Graduate Certificate in Wellbeing in Education is accredited by the University as a Level 8 AQF qualification.

4.4 Duration

The Volume of Learning for the Graduate Certificate in Wellbeing in Education is 0.5 years of equivalent full-time study. An option to complete this Program Part-time is available.

An accelerated option to complete the Program is not available.

4.5 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Graduate Certificate in Wellbeing in Education Award is three years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

4.6 Study Mode

The Graduate Certificate in Wellbeing in Education is offered online.

4.7 Professional Accreditation

There are no professional accreditation requirements applicable to this Program.

5 ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

5.1 University Admission Requirements

The Graduate Certificate in Wellbeing in Education is a graduate-level program for teachers, education professionals and associated professions, who wish to gain additional knowledge and recognition as a specialist in leading wellbeing in education

7.2 Program Learning Outcomes

Students meeting the award requirements for this qualification should be able to achieve the following outcomes:

- 1) apply advanced theoretical knowledge, skills, and professional practice to support and lead wellbeing in educational contexts
- 2) critically evaluate contemporary approaches to inform the development of approaches to student and staff wellbeing
- 3) synthesise knowledge to identify and develop solutions to complex problems affecting staff and student wellbeing
- 4) apply cognitive, technical, and creative skills to generate understanding of complex educational issues in wellbeing
- 5) identify, understand, and respond to critical issues impacting wellbeing in educational contexts.

7.3 Required Courses

To be eligible for the award of Graduate Certificate in Wellbeing in Education students must complete a minimum of 100 Units of Credit chosen from the courses listed in Appendix A.
