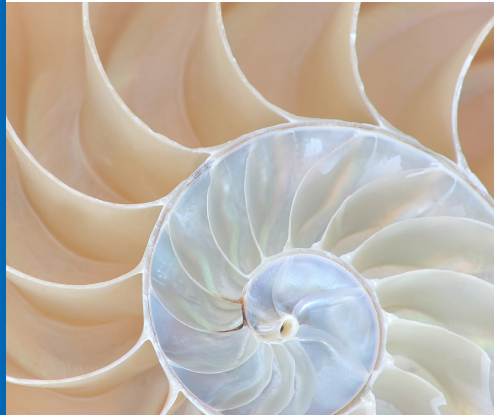

## Master Class in Moral Philosophy: Aquinas & Kant on Final Ends

Monday 28 August 2017



A *final end* is any human purpose whose attainment is not viewed as instrumental to any further purpose. This master class will be a focused study of the role that this concept plays in the philosophical writings of St. Thomas Aquinas and Immanuel Kant.

The class will be of interest to students and researchers working in moral philosophy (and related fields) and represents a unique opportunity to study with one of the world's leading experts on moral philosophy and the history of philosophy. The class will be particularly valuable for those interested in understanding how conceptions of human nature have been used in the history of ethics, and how this might be valuable for thinking through contemporary ethical questions.

**Candace Vogler** is a Professor of Philosophy at the University of Chicago, and Principal Investigator on the John Templeton project *Virtue, Happiness, and the Meaning of Life*. She is the author of *Reasonably Vicious* (Harvard University Press) and has published widely in the fields of ethics and the history of philosophy. She is a Distinguished Visiting Fulbright Professor at Notre Dame's Institute for Ethics & Society.
