# University life in Sydney

Notre Dame's Sydney Campus is located across two sites, both in the vibrant social hub of the city:

**Our Broadway site** is located at the heart of Sydney's university district, a short walk from Central train station, close to Darling Harbour and also near the city's world famous Chinatown district. It is home to most of our academic Schools including Arts & Sciences, Business, Education, Law and Philosophy & Theology.

**The Darlinghurst site** is nestled in Sydney's famous shopping district – showcasing the world's leading fashion brands, and cafés that set the benchmark for Australia's café-culture. It is strategically located near St Vincent's Hospital which is recognised worldwide for the role it plays at the cutting edge of medical science. The Hospital is a key partner of Notre Dame's Schools of Medicine and Nursing.

# University life in Fremantle (Perth)

Notre Dame's beachside Campus is located in the historic West End of Fremantle, within Perth in Western Australia. Housed within beautiful restored heritage buildings, it provides a 'town university' of great character and charm.

The iconic Campus is close to the Fremantle Harbour, all major transport hubs, cafés and restaurants that reflect the truly multicultural lifestyle of the port city, one-off fashion boutiques and speciality shops that draw thousands of international visitors each year. On the Fremantle Campus, you can choose between living in the heart of the historic West End, five minutes from the beach or nearby in either shared or private rental accommodation.



### Residential Halls

# Student support

Student Services is dedicated to the wellbeing of international students by facilitating their participation in student life and providing counselling and other support services.



## ACADEMIC ENABLING & SUPPORT CENTRE

Notre Dame is committed to providing international students with quality academic support from the beginning of their academic careers, all the way through to graduation. With a strong emphasis on 'the whole student', and supported by a dedicated team of lecturers and tutors, the Academic Enabling & Support Centre offers a range of educational and study programs, as well as help for students with disability requirements. Individual learning plans can be designed to support international students.

The Academic Enabling & Support Centre offers students:

- › **Free Lunchtime Workshops** are designed to support the learning of students across the University. The workshops are held throughout the semester, are open to all students, and cover a range of topics such as essay techniques, study skills, research and referencing protocols.
- › **One-on-one tutoring** with academic advisors
- › **Success Now! Study Preparation Workshops** are run prior to the commencement of each semester and help students to prepare for their studies. Topics include: Human Biology, Essential Mathematics, Study Skills, Uni Success and Computer Survival Skills.

International students can access a wide range of services at Student Administration including:

All new international students will have a peer mentor who is from the same school or discipline. Connecting with an already established student will help students to become familiar with the Campus and services available to them as well as meeting new people.

Notre Dame provides a free and confidential counselling service to help students develop skills and strategies that enable you to achieve your personal and academic goals, and make your time at university more comfortable and stress-free.

## NOTRE DAME VOLUNTEER NETWORK

The Notre Dame Volunteer Network provides you with an opportunity to offer your services to agencies and organisations who work with people in need. The Network embodies the University's Objects in building a community and uses Catholic social teaching as a foundation for service to others.

## STUDENT ASSOCIATION AND CLUBS

- › Encouraging the integration of discipline-specific knowledge with transferable, interdisciplinary skills; and
- › Bringing together students from different disciplines and backgrounds to study collaboratively key themes from Western philosophy and Catholic theological traditions with a contemporary perspective.

The program is intriguing, enjoyable, builds mind and character, and leads to questions that will help students make their life and work more meaningful and richer in potential. Students will learn to think creatively and critically and see the world, its opportunities and their place in it more clearly. They will graduate with the ability to think and reason – strengths highly valued by future employers.

## WORK INTEGRATED LEARNING

The School of Arts & Sciences offers you the chance to learn on location through a series of internship and service-learning programs. Normally undertaken in the final semester, the internship program places students on location in a real work environment within the profession they hope to enter. You will gain academic credit as part of the internship. In addition, students may wish to travel overseas as part of their degree. Notre Dame has strong links with universities around the world that pave the way for students to complete part of their degree at partner institutions for one semester.

Minors, comprising six courses, are also available.

Archaeology involves the synthesis and interpretation of material remains from past human actions. It is invaluable to a growing range of industry sectors such as mining, private heritage consultancy, and natural and cultural heritage management.

The program provides students with comprehensive training in broad archaeology components including method and theory, field survey and excavation, as well as the specific sub-disciplines of Indigenous, historical and maritime archaeology. The Bachelor of Arts (Politics & Journalism) program combines studies in communications and media with a rigorous grounding in the areas of politics and international relations, history, legal studies, Aboriginal studies, and economics, providing significant depth to the degree. ## PLAYERS CAN BENEFIT FROM HEAD TRAUMA EDUCATION, REFLECTION: RESEARCH

A team from The University of Notre Dame Australia's Institute for Health Research is investigating the short-term links between head trauma and depression in young football players.

The research, led by PhD candidate, Sarah Harris, with support of a team of academics from the University, indicates that players exposed to concussion exhibit changes in emotional wellbeing and cognitive function as they age.

"Findings to date show that 35 players reported 194 head knocks over the course of a football season. Those who received one or more head knocks reported statistically significant higher levels of depressive symptoms than those who received no head knocks.

"These were injuries that were not diagnosed as a concussion by a club's medical staff, therefore allowing the player to train or take part in a match the following week," she added.

Research supervisor, Associate Professor Fiona Farrington said players, coaches, parents and support staff can benefit from being more aware of the potential negative impact of head knocks on mental health.

"This may lead to closer monitoring of symptoms and emotional changes, resulting in a supportive environment that encourages players to seek early medical assistance within or outside the club," she said.

“It has a very good environment. It is a small university with good values.

Isabel said Notre Dame is very intellectually stimulating, and also praised the support she had received from the International Students Committee which she said had been very beneficial.

## MENTORING PROGRAM

Every Notre Dame law student has the opportunity to be mentored by experienced lawyers during their degree, including judges, Senior Counsel, partners of law firms and politicians. Via the mentoring program, students can, from their first year at university, develop professional connections at senior levels.

The mentoring program gives students the opportunity to discuss legal practice areas they are interested in with senior lawyers and experience them by joining their mentor as they go about their work in Court, in Chambers or in the office.

The School of Philosophy & Theology takes a leading role in the exploration and realisation of the University's Objects and offers programs to students who wish to pursue careers in academia, in the Church, schools or organisations that require the specialist skills acquired through coursework.



The University emphasises the Catholic intellectual tradition, a tradition that values and promotes the whole person as a pathway to an ethical and informed way of living. All students participate in the 'community of enquiry' through the Core Curriculum courses of Philosophy, Ethics and Theology, exploring issues that go to the heart of participation in public life, with the aim of developing valuable life skills and broadening social and cultural values.

You will develop critical thinking skills, the ability to communicate effectively, the capacity to defend a reasoned point of view on ethical and moral issues, and the expertise necessary for leadership in our contemporary society.

### BACHELOR OF THEOLOGY

### BACHELOR OF PHYSIOTHERAPY

The Bachelor of Physiotherapy focuses on the physiotherapist-client relationship and is highly practical in nature. Physiotherapy students undertake a comprehensive university program, including specialised physiotherapy studies, behavioural and health sciences, and professional development.

The program is developed around the concept of physiotherapy as an applied science with foundation sciences introduced to the student in parallel with their studies. Throughout the program, emphasis is placed on the importance of evidence-based clinical practice and the use of ongoing research in physiotherapy, designed to develop and build student research skills for use in professional practice.

Professional ethics and behaviour are key integrating factors.

## HONOURS

The Honours program is embedded within the standard four years of the Physiotherapy program and the five years of the double degree. Students with high levels of achievement (Distinction average) may be invited to consider the Honours program.

The Honours program comprises the design and development of a research project and the completion of a research dissertation, all supervised by a member of the University's Research staff. Honours students enrol in a specific Honours research program in Semester 2 of their third-year and the final year.

## WORK INTEGRATED LEARNING

Increasing exposure to clinical experience is a key integrating factor of the Physiotherapy program. From first-year, students are exposed to clinical practice through a Pre-Clinical Experience program. The formal clinical education program commences with a five-week placement in second-year, continues into third-year and culminates in almost full-time clinical practice during the final year of the program. Students develop clinical assessment, treatment skills and reflective professional practice in laboratories and through exposure to patients in physiotherapy practices, hospital or community health settings in urban and rural centres.

## ENGLISH LANGUAGE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The University of Notre Dame requires applicants to demonstrate English language competency appropriate to the level stipulated for their nominated program. Successful completion of specified secondary or tertiary education in English can be used to demonstrate competency.

Accepted proficiency tests are Academic International English Language Testing System (IELTS), Teaching of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), Cambridge Academic English (CAE), Pearson Test for English, Academic (PTE) or Occupational English Test (OET). Note that not all tests can be used to prove English language proficiency for all programs.

Other evidence, including recent successful tertiary level studies in English from an official English-speaking country, may be accepted on review by the University.

The Admissions Office reserves the right to ask any applicant to sit an English language proficiency test as deemed necessary.

Please note some programs require a higher English Language score (Education, Nursing, Law and Physiotherapy).

## ACADEMIC ENGLISH BRIDGING (ELICOS) PROGRAMS

Notre Dame provides three Academic English Bridging Courses on Fremantle Campus, which are designed to develop language proficiency and assist students in meeting the University's English language requirements for entry for their nominated undergraduate or postgraduate program.

**Academic English Bridging Level 1 (AEB1)** is a 10-week (two five-week blocks with a one-week study break) program designed for students arriving at a language level equivalent of level IELTS 6.0 and is followed by AEB Study Skills. Successful completion of both programs will enable entry into undergraduate and postgraduate courses with an English language entry requirement of IELTS 6.5 or equivalent.

**Academic English Bridging Level 2 (AEB2)** is a 15-week program of study (17 weeks including two one-week study breaks) designed for students arriving at a language level equivalent of level IELTS 6.5. The program focuses on providing English for Academic Purposes together with a Study Skills component and available to students requiring Upper Intermediate/Advanced level English Language instruction for Academic Purposes.

Successful completion of the 15-week AEB2 program will enable entry into undergraduate, postgraduate or Higher Degree by research (HDR) courses with an English language entry requirement of IELTS 7.0 or equivalent.

**Academic English Bridging Study Skills (AEB Study Skills)** is an intensive five-week program focused on providing the acquisition of discipline-specific language skills to prepare students for academic life and study. The program will prepare students for academic life and study as well as acquaint them with current teaching and learning methodologies typically used within an Australian university setting.

This program is suitable for students who seek entry to an undergraduate or postgraduate program where they have one or more bands lower than the overall IELTS required for entry; and/or have prior academic and life/work experience that indicates they would benefit from undertaking this course for successful transition to university studies.

### 1 AM I AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT?

You are an international student if you are:

- › a temporary resident (visa status) of Australia;
- › a permanent resident (visa status) of New Zealand; or
- › a resident or citizen of any other country

International students studying in Australia on a student visa can only study full-time and there are also specific entry requirements that must be met.

Australian citizens, permanent residents and students studying outside of Australia may have the choice of full-time, part-time and external study, depending on program availability and in-country requirements.

### 2 WHAT DOES 'CERTIFIED COPY' MEAN?

A certified copy is a photocopy of an original document that has been sighted, stamped and signed by a certifying agent. The accepted people who can do this include Australian Consular official, High Commission or Trade official, Public notary, an Agent approved by Notre Dame to act on your behalf and Notre Dame Admissions staff members. Documents can also be certified by one of Notre Dame's contracted agent partners (see [www.notredame.edu.au/international/agents](http://www.notredame.edu.au/international/agents)).

All copies of transcripts and official documents accompanying an application must be certified.
