

Cannulation

This course is aims to provide participants with theoretical understanding of cannulation including indications, contraindications, cannula sizing, vein anatomy and selection, aseptic technique, and the procedure. This theoretical understanding is consolidated with demonstration and supervised practice of the procedure on a part task trainer (manikin) with safety and non-safety cannulas using sterile and no sterile gloves. This course does not determine competency or utilise human participants for insertions. The course is designed as a precursor to facility based, supervised insertions where competence is determined at a facility level as per local policy. The course centers around the national Australian Commission for Safety and Quality on Health Care (ACSQHC) Management of Peripheral Intravenous Catheters Clinical Care Standard. The course consists of one hour online pre-reading and four hours of face-to-face practice time.

Who is this course for?

 Nurses, midwives, doctors, paramedics, medics, and other healthcare professionals required to cannulate patients in their role

What you will study

At course completion, participants should be able to:

- Discuss the indications and contraindications for cannulation
- Review venous anatomy of the distal upper limb and the assessment of a suitable vein for cannulation
- Determine the most appropriate cannula size and vein location for various situations
- Review aseptic technique principles and requirements related to the cannulation procedure
- Discuss the cannulation procedure step-by-step with commentary to determine rationales for procedural steps
- Supervised practice of multiple insertions into a part task trainer (manikin) with correction to ensure safe and effective insertions in accordance with national guidelines
- Scenario based application of theory and practical principles of cannulation
- Demonstrate understanding of the ACSQHC Management of Peripheral Intravenous Catheters Clinical Care Standard
