3 PURPOSE

These Program Requirements set out the approved requirements for the Master of Nursing (Coursework).

4 OVFRVIFW

4.1 Campus Availability

The Master of Nursing (Coursework) has been approved for delivery from the Fremantle (WA), Broome (WA), Sydney (NSW) Campuses and Melbourne (VIC) Clinical School, Werribee.

4.2 Student Availability

The Master of Nursing (Coursework) is available for enrolment to domestic Students.

4.3 Australian Qualifications Framework

The Master of Nursing (Coursework) is accredited by the University as a Level 9 AQF qualification.

4.4 Duration

The Volume of Learning for the Master of Nursing (Coursework) is 1.5 years of equivalent full-time study.

An option to complete this Program Part-time is available.

An accelerated option to complete the Program is not available.

4.5 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Master of Nursing (Coursework) Award is 6 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

4.6 Study Mode

The Master of Nursing (Coursework) is offered in online Study mode.

4.7 Professional Accreditation

There are no professional accreditation requirements applicable to this Program.

5 ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

5.1 University Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission to The University of Notre Dame Australia, all applicants must meet the <u>University's minimum requirements for admission</u>. The requirements for admission are detailed in the University's Policy: *Admissions*.

5.2 Specific Program Requirements for Admission

To be eligible for admission to the Master of Nursing (Coursework) applicants must also meet the following specific requirements.

- 5.2.1 Current licence to practice as a Registered Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia or provisional registration, whichever is applicable at the time of the student's program commencement;
- 5.2.2 Nursing or other appropriate degree or the equivalent;
- 5.2.3 Minimum of one year relevant post registration nursing experience.

6 PRACTICUM OR INTERNSHIP REQUIREMENTS

6.1 There are no practicum or internship requirements in this Award.

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7 PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

7.1 Program Description

Nursing is a practice profession that requires all nurses to maintain competency and participate in activities that contribute to professional and practice development. The Master of Nursing program aims to enhance the knowledge and confidence of nurses to conduct independent studies. Students will learn the pragmatic considerations of systematic inquiry by adopting an experiential, inquiry-based approach to learning. The program will promote debate and discussion enabling the student to become a competent consumer of evidence-based practice and able to contribute knowledge to the discipline of nursing. Questions arising from the student's nursing practice will address contemporary health care issues. The focus of the online program will be to evaluate evidence in order to make informed judgements about the robustness and utility of the findings to nursing practice. The program will also provide an important link between research and nursing practice and will encourage the development of a culture of collaborative studies between practice and academia. Students who have completed a Graduate Diploma and a core curriculum course can apply for advanced standing and be eligible for specialisation.

7.2 Program Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the Master of Nursing (Coursework) graduates will be able to:

- 1. Analyse and interpret nursing scenarios to provide evidence-based quality practice.
- 2. Critically reflect clinical practice techniques in a range of learning activities to promote professional practice.
- 3. Apply leadership and collaborative skills within an interprofessional health care environment.
- 4. Apply concepts of global, medico-legal, social, and cultural diversity.
- 5. Identify the distinguishing characteristics of nursing research in terms of purposes, underlying assumptions, and available methodologies.
- 6. Explore the principal paradigms employed in health and nursing research and differentiate between them in terms of their epistemological bases, their respective strengths, and limitations in addressing different types of research.
- 7. Formulate questions amenable to research and align those questions to appropriate research designs, data collection procedures, techniques, and data analysis.
- 8. Critique examples of research studies and models, identifying strengths and limitations of design that might threaten the internal validity and generalisability (external validity) of the findings.
- 9. Identify the important ethical or other issues when conducting nursing research and apply value appropriate safeguards to the interests of all stakeholders involved a research project.
- 10. Apply advanced technical skills and reflective practice within the domain of nursing research.

7.3 Required Courses

To be eligible for the award of Master of Nursing (Coursework) students must complete a minimum of 300 Units of Credit chosen from the courses listed in Appendix A comprising:

75 Units of Credit from three (3) Postgraduate Elective courses

75 Units of Credit from three (3) Postgraduate Nursing courses

25 Units of Credit from one (1) Postgraduate Research Elective Course

25 Units of Credit from one (1) core curriculum course

100 Units of Credit from two (2) Master courses

7.4 Elective Courses

Students enrolled in the Master of Nursing (Coursework) are required to complete 4 elective courses. Elective courses can be selected from the approved list of course offerings listed in Appendix B.

7.5 Course substitutions

Course substitution will be at the discretion of the post graduate Program Coordinator and the National Head of School.
