3 PURPOSE

These Program Regulations set out the approved requirements for the Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking, Graduate Diploma of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking and Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking).

4 OVERVIEW

4.1 Campus Availability

The Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking, Graduate Diploma of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking and Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking) have been approved for delivery on the Fremantle Campus and the Sydney Campus.

4.2 Student Availability

The Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking, Graduate Diploma of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking and Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking) are available for enrolment to domestic Students, off-shore students and international Students, except those on a student visa.

4.3 Australian Qualifications Framework

The Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking and the Graduate Diploma of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking are accredited by the University as Level 8 AQF qualifications. The Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking) is accredited by the University as a Level 9 AQF qualification.

4.4 Duration

The Volume of Learning for the Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking is 0.5 years of equivalent full-time study.

The Volume of Learning for the Graduate Diploma in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking is 1 year of equivalent full-time study.

The Volume of Learning for the Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking) is 2 years of equivalent full-time study.

An option to complete this Program part-time is available.

4.5 Maximum Duration

4.5.1 The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking Award is 3 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

4.5.2 The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Graduate Diploma of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking is 5 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

4.5.3 The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking) is 7 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

4.6 Study Mode

These awards are offered in Multimode study mode.

4.7 Professional Accreditation

There are no professional accreditation requirements applicable to this Program.

5 ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

5.1 University Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission to The University of Notre Dame Australia, all applicants must meet the [University's minimum requirements for admission](#). The requirements for admission are detailed in the University's Policy: *Admissions*.

5.2 Specific Program Requirements for Admission

To be eligible for admission to the **Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking** applicants must also meet the following specific requirements:

- As a minimum qualification, a recognised Bachelor degree (AQF level 7 qualification) or equivalent in any discipline area
OR
- Applicants without a Bachelor level qualification may be eligible to enter the Program if they have at least two years' experience in a related field. This would be determined on a case-by-case basis

To be eligible for admission to the **Graduate Diploma of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking** applicants must meet the following specific requirements:

- Possession of a recognised Bachelor degree (AQF level 7 qualification) or equivalent in any discipline area;
OR
- Applicants without a Bachelor level qualification may be eligible to enter the Program if they have at least two years' experience in a related field. This would be determined on a case-by-case basis
OR
- Possession of a Graduate Certificate (AQF level 8 qualification) in **Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking** or a related discipline

To be eligible for admission to the **Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking)** applicants must meet the following specific requirements:

- Possession of a Bachelor's award (AQF level 7 qualification) or equivalent in any discipline area
OR
- Applicants without a Bachelor level qualification may be eligible to enter the Program if they have at least 2 years' experience in a related field. This would be determined on a case-by-case basis
OR
- Possession of a Graduate Certificate or a Graduate Diploma (AQF level 8 qualifications) in **Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking** or a related discipline.

6 PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

6.1 Program Descriptions:

Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking

The Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking introduces students to the concepts of modern slavery and human trafficking, including key facets such as Australian and International legislative responses, risks in business and supply chains, and efforts made by global and local organisations to combat the phenomena. The program contextualises modern slavery and human trafficking globally, as well as examining ethics and decision-making.

Graduate Diploma of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking

The Graduate Diploma of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking provides analysis of the concepts of modern slavery and human trafficking, including key facets such as Australian and International legislative responses, risks in business and supply chains, and efforts made by global and local organisations to combat the phenomena. The program contextualises modern slavery and human

trafficking globally, as well as examining ethics and decision-making. The program includes elective courses that provide students with the opportunity to respond to contemporary examples of modern slavery and human trafficking; the opportunity to study cognate courses offered by the university in Law, Business, Ethics and Social Justice; and may include contributions from local and international people with expertise and first-hand experience in the field of modern slavery and human trafficking. Opportunities for work integrated learning may also be possible.

Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking)

The Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking) provides high-level analysis of the concepts of modern slavery and human trafficking and contextualises these issues in an international, national and local context. It enhances awareness and develops structures for ethical decision-making. It provides dynamic opportunities for engagement with organisations and individuals who work to combat modern slavery and human trafficking. Students may complete elective courses that focus on their particular areas of interest.

This program provides both research and practitioner-focused study modes. The research mode provides students with the research design and methodology they need to undertake high level research culminating in a substantial research project, focusing on end-user research. The practitioner-focused mode aims to provide graduates with specialist insights and expertise, designed to ensure ethical decision-making and the development of future industry leaders. Students complete an applied professional project, co-designed with partner organisations, and focused on applying professional skills to specific workplaces and anti-slavery/trafficking groups.

6.2 Program Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the **Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking** graduates will be able to:

1. Demonstrate specialised knowledge of modern slavery and human trafficking in local, national and international contexts
2. Identify economic, social and political factors that allow modern slavery and human trafficking to operate
3. Evaluate the effectiveness of nation state diplomacy and domestic and international laws to prevent modern slavery and human trafficking
4. Evaluate the effectiveness of initiatives by non-government organisations and agencies to prevent modern slavery and human trafficking
5. Reflect on how personal decisions and actions can progress change to ensure the dignity and human rights of people.

Program Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the **Graduate Diploma of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking** graduates will be able to:

1. Demonstrate advanced knowledge of modern slavery and human trafficking in local, national and international contexts
2. Critically analyse economic, social and political factors that allow modern slavery and human trafficking to operate
3. Evaluate the effectiveness of nation state diplomacy and domestic and international laws to prevent modern slavery and human trafficking
4. Evaluate the effectiveness of initiatives by non-government organisations and agencies to prevent modern slavery and human trafficking
5. Reflect on how personal decisions and actions can progress change to ensure the dignity and human rights of people
6. Work independently and, where appropriate, in collaboration with others

Program Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the **Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking)** graduates will be able to:

1. Demonstrate advanced knowledge of modern slavery and human trafficking in local, national and international contexts
2. Critically analyse and evaluate issues related to modern slavery and human trafficking
3. Synthesise complex information and evaluate proposed actions, solutions and strategies to eradicate modern slavery and human trafficking
4. Demonstrate well-developed and highly adaptive communication skills to inform audiences about the complex issues surrounding modern slavery and human trafficking
5. Apply knowledge, initiative and creativity to plan and execute a substantial research based project or professional project in the area of modern slavery and human trafficking
6. Work as a reflective and independent researcher and/or professional practitioner and, where appropriate, in collaboration with others.

6.3 Required Courses

To be eligible for the award of **Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking** students must complete a minimum of 100 Units of Credit chosen from the courses listed in Appendix A comprising:

- 50 Units of Credit from two (2) compulsory Courses

To be eligible for the award of **Graduate Diploma of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking** students must complete a minimum of 200 Units of Credit chosen from the courses listed in Appendix A comprising:

- 75 Units of Credit from three (3) compulsory Courses

To be eligible for the award of **Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking)** students must complete a minimum of 400 Units of Credit chosen from the courses listed in Appendix A comprising:

- 250 Units of Credit from compulsory Courses

6.4 Elective Courses

To be eligible for the award of **Graduate Certificate in Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking** students must complete a minimum of 100 Units of Credit chosen from the courses listed in Appendix A comprising:

- 50 Units of Credit from two (2) elective Courses

To be eligible for the award of **Graduate Diploma of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking** students must complete a minimum of 200 Units of Credit chosen from the courses listed in Appendix A comprising:

- 125 Units of Credit from five (5) elective Courses

To be eligible for the award of **Master of Arts (Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking)** students must complete a minimum of 400 Units of Credit chosen from the courses listed in Appendix A comprising:

- 150 Units of Credit from six (6) elective Courses

6.5 Course substitutions

Course substitutions, where permitted, must be approved by the National Head of School or delegate.
