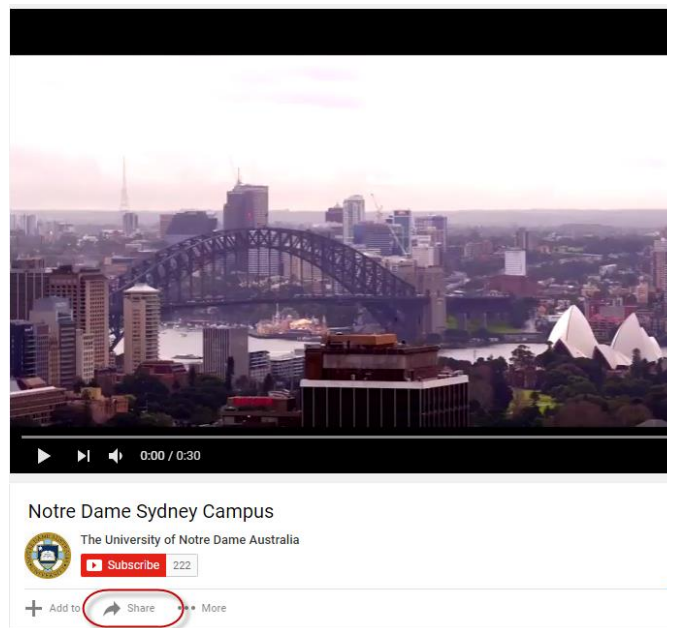


Embedding YouTube Videos in Blackboard

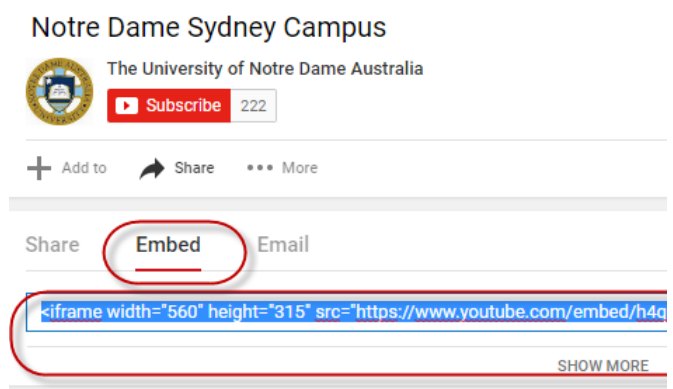
You can embed YouTube video content in your Blackboard course to display as a player using either of the two methods described below.

*A. From YouTube using iframe code (this method is particularly useful if you created an **unlisted*** video for your students):*

1. Open YouTube in a new tab/window and locate the target video (use "Search" or paste the URL)
2. In the options below the video click **Share**

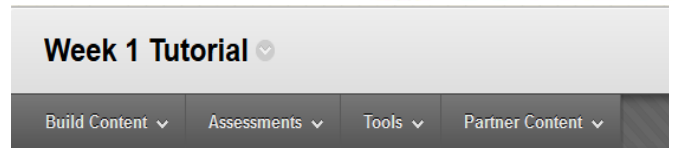


3. Click **Embed**, and highlight and copy the iframe code (<Ctrl C>)

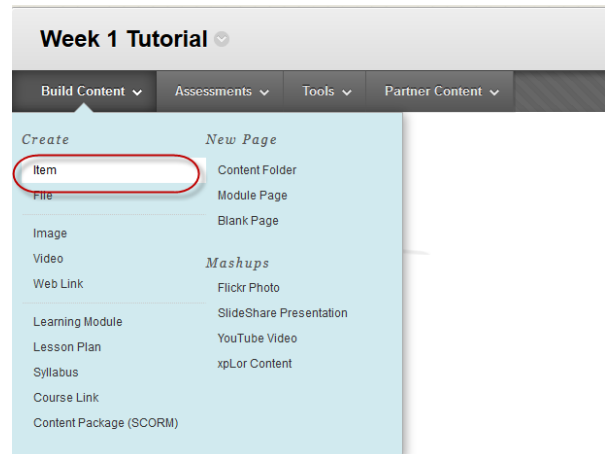


4. Log into Blackboard
5. Set **Edit Mode** to **ON**

6. Navigate to the content area where you want the video to appear



7. Click on the **Build Content** dropdown menu then select **Item**



8. **Content Information**
Give the video a **Name**

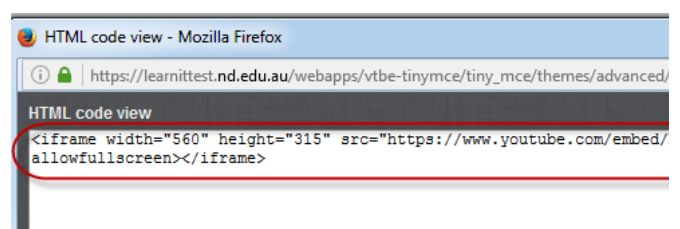
9. Click on the **HTML** button to call the HTML editor.



Note. If you cannot see the HTML button, click on the **Show More** button to reveal



10. Paste the iframe code into this window (<Ctrl V>) then click **Update**

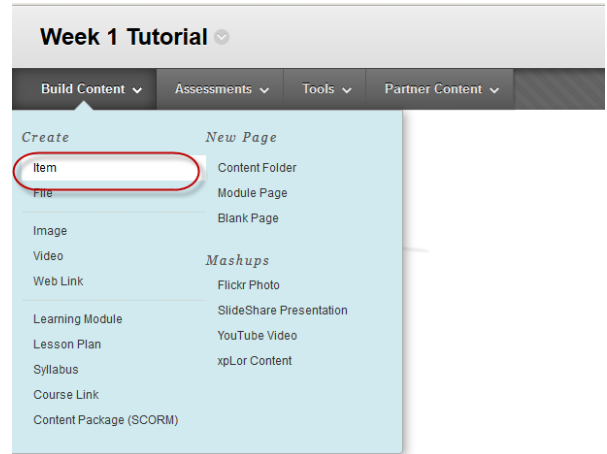
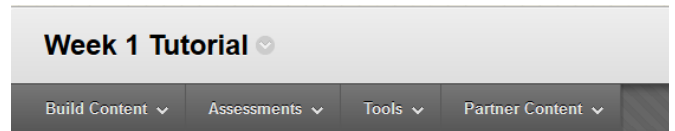


11. Click **Submit**

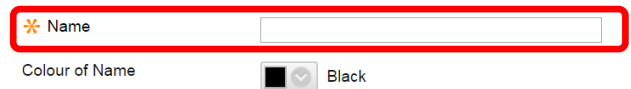
B. Directly from within Blackboard (it includes a YouTube search function):

1. Log into Blackboard
2. Set **Edit Mode** to **ON**
3. Navigate to the content area where you want the video to appear
4. Click on the **Build Content** dropdown menu then select **Item**

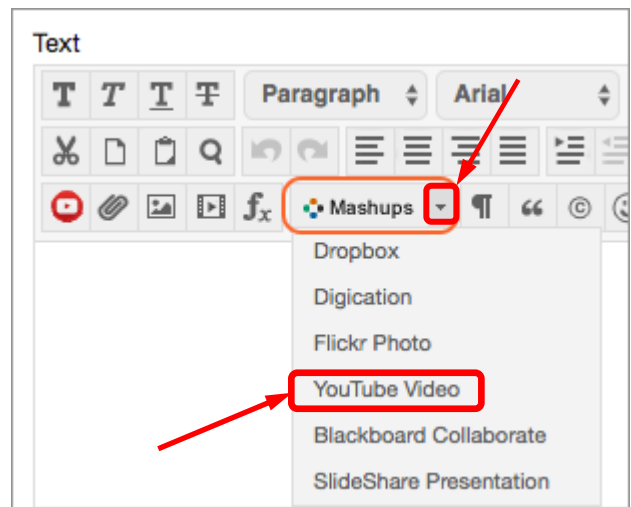


5. Give your item a **Name** in the Content Information section

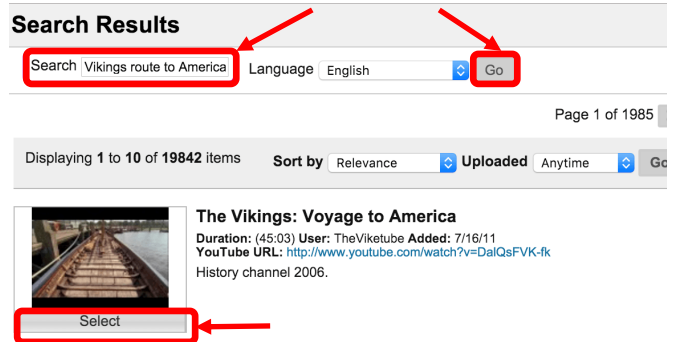
6. In the text box, click on the **drop-down** arrow to the right of **Mashups** button and select **YouTube Video** from the drop-down menu



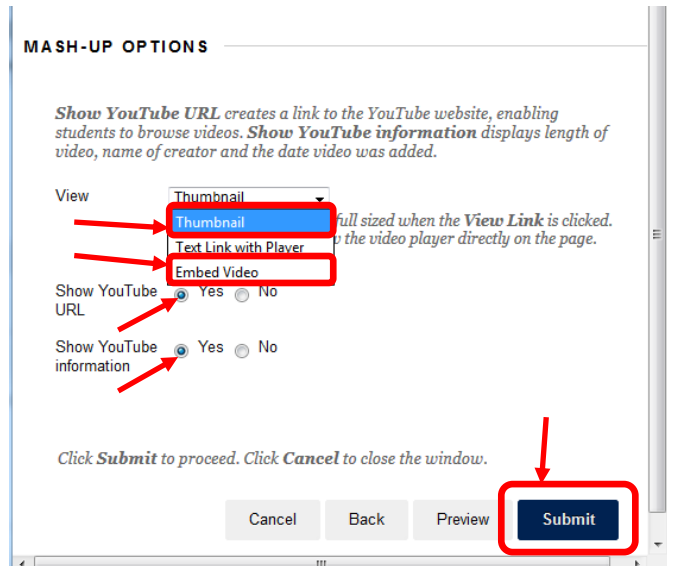
Note. If you cannot see the **Mashups** button, click on the **Show More** button to reveal



7. Use the **Search** bar to type in your topic and click on **Go** button.
Once the results of your search are loaded, click on **Select** button to add the video into your text box



8. In the next window, select Mash-up options: either **Thumbnail** (will show small on your page, but will open in a new, bigger window once the *View Link* button is clicked) or **Embed Video** (will show the actual-size video player directly on the page).
Selecting **Show YouTube URL** option will enable the students to browse videos via a link to the YouTube website, and **Show YouTube information** will display length of video, name or its creator and the date it was added.
Do not forget to **submit!** 😊



9. You can add introductory text (e.g., discussion questions, suggested activities etc.) into the same textbox, in front of or behind your embedded video – just position your cursor in the desired spot inside the textbox and start typing.
