INTRODUCTION

The Masters by Research is a postgraduate research degree comprising a substantial research component culminating in the submission of a thesis or equivalent for independent examination by two external examiners.

SUPERVISION

Each candidate is required to have a minimum of two supervisors who will provide support and academic guidance throughout the degree. The candidate's supervisors will assist the candidate with the preparation of their research proposal. The research supervisors will mentor and direct the candidate throughout the research phase and up to the point the thesis is put forward for examination.

Before submitting an application, prospective students are encouraged to contact the relevant School or the University's Research Office to arrange a discussion with a suitably qualified member of academic staff.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The Masters by Research is a thesis-based research degree, normally comprised exclusively of supervised research, but which can include research training coursework if appropriate.

MODE OF STUDY AND ASSESSMENT

Candidates in the Masters by Research program can undertake their research in either a full-time or a part-time capacity. The maximum time for completion of the Masters by Research (not including periods of approved leave of absence) will normally be two years for a full-time student and four years for a part-time student. The minimum time for completion will normally be one year. The Masters thesis is assessed by external examiners.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The following criteria are required for a student to be admitted to the Masters by Research program:

- Completion of an undergraduate degree from a recognised university, which has been completed at a superior standard and which demonstrates the applicant's potential to undertake and complete research-based study; or
- In exceptional circumstances, an equivalent academic background or extensive professional experience that is considered by the Dean of the School to be an appropriate preparation for independent study and research work at Masters level.

An applicant may be required to demonstrate an ability to understand and communicate in both written and spoken English at a level adequate for the purpose of pursuing the program of study as deemed appropriate by the Dean of the School.

FEES AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Domestic Students

In accordance with the *Commonwealth Scholarships Guidelines (Research) 2017*, domestic research students are eligible to have Higher Degree by Research (HDR) program fees paid for by the Commonwealth Government through a Research Training Program (RTP) Fees Offset Scholarship.

Domestic students can also apply for stipend scholarships. These scholarships are very competitive and are awarded to students of exceptional research potential. The scholarships are for the purpose of assisting with general living costs for the duration of the research degree.

International Students

All international research students are required to pay full fees for the length of their research degree. Please refer to the International Guide for current program fees.

The University is also keen to support high calibre international students. International students are also eligible to apply for Commonwealth Government Research Training Program (RTP)
