

Adult Deterioration: Assessment, Prevention, & Treatment (ADAPT)

The full day Adult Deterioration: Assessment Prevention, and Treatment (ADAPT) course is an 8-hour face to face professional programme focusing upon the recognition and response to the clinically deteriorating adult in the hospital setting. The course utilises a mixture of presentations, skills workshops, case studies and hands on simulated clinical scenarios, to apply knowledge and clinical skills, using a structured ABCDE approach to the assessment and management of clinical deterioration. This approach to learning facilitates understanding of the core physiological changes linked to clinical deterioration, and applies rapid assessment and intervention, alongside interdisciplinary teamwork, communication, and collaboration. Four hours of pre-course activities are also included in this course.

Who is this course for?

 Existing health professional (nurses, doctors, paramedics) wanting to understand more about clinical deterioration, patient assessment and management or looking to refresh and update existing knowledge and skills

What you will study

At course completion, participants should be able to:

- Explain the factors that that contribute to clinical deterioration in the adult patient
- Understand the evidence base supporting the use of track and trigger systems and the monitoring of vital signs
- Discuss how effective teamwork and communication and human factors contribute to the successful recognition and response to clinical deterioration
- Apply the systematic ABCDE approach to simulated clinical scenarios
- Apply relevant techniques to the assessment and management of airway problems in the deteriorating patient
- Explain how pathophysiological changes relate to sign and symptoms in the deteriorating patient
- Provide a rationale for initial interventions based upon the patient's changing pathophysiology and the need for timely management
