



Paediatric Basics in Acute Care

This full day course aims to provide those with limited paediatric healthcare experience with an understanding of the differences of paediatrics anatomically and physiologically and how this impacts illness and injury assessment and management in the acute setting. Paediatric presentations including croup, bronchiolitis, asthma, febrile illness, seizures and "one pill kills" will be discussed as well as workshopping and demonstration of tools that can be used to ensure safe paediatric medication and fluid administration practices. The course consists of two hours precourse activities and an eight-hour online webinar.

- ✓ Nurses new to caring for paediatric patients in the acute care setting (ED, urgent care)
- Other healthcare professionals involved in the acute care of paediatric patients
- ✓ Anyone with an interest in learning about paediatric acute management

What you will study

At course completion, participants should be able to:

- Discuss the anatomical and physiologic differences between paediatrics and adults
- Discuss the assessment of paediatric patients using the ABCDE approach
- ✓ Discuss the pathophysiology, assessment, and management of paediatric presentations including anaphylaxis, seizures, febrile illnesses, respiratory illnesses
- Review paediatric medication and fluid charts and resources to aid in the safe administration of paediatric medication and fluids
- Discuss accidental and non-accidental injury and screening
- Discuss paediatric toxicology basics and "one-pill-kills"
