

Notre Dame helps make a difference to people's lives through a range of study tours and projects.

OVERSEAS STUDY TOURS

Students of History, Politics, Literature and other disciplines benefit significantly from Notre Dame's Overseas study tours and this study is included in your degree.

The University's own lecturers lead the tours – to destinations such as Spain, the UK, Ireland, Indonesia and the USA – for up to four weeks where intensive study is undertaken of the history, politics, language, culture and environment of the host city or country.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT, CULTURAL IMMERSION

Our short-term service-learning and cultural immersion program – designed to contribute not only to programs of study but also personal development, takes students on life-changing journeys to the world's developing countries including:

- › Cambodia: Social Justice students at the School of Arts & Sciences engage with community leaders to learn everything from homelessness and poverty to social empowerment and solidarity following the fall of the Pol Pot regime.
- › Timor-Leste, India, and Cambodia: Education students take their classroom knowledge to small, rural communities to deliver lessons in creative arts, language, sporting skills and everything in between to children of all ages.
- › Kenya, Zimbabwe: Arts, Business, Education and Medicine students work within marginalised communities to support the men, women and children overcome a life cycle of poverty.

VOLUNTEER PROJECTS

Notre Dame students have a rich history of making a difference through involvement in volunteer projects both in Australia and abroad. During your time at the University, you will have opportunities to participate in social justice and charity projects which contribute both to the greater good and your own personal development. How to accept your offer

IF YOU WISH TO ACCEPT YOUR PLACE:

1. Complete the Conditions of Offer and Acceptance

Form. We suggest you make a copy for your records.

Note: Your Student ID number is in your Offer Letter.

2. Complete the FEE-HELP/HECS-HELP Application.

These should be returned to the Admissions Office within 14 days of receiving your offer. Fees need to be paid two weeks before the commencement of the semester or you need to have your FEE-HELP/HECS-HELP Form lodged by then.

3. Attend one of the Enrolment Days (see enclosed Enrolment Schedule).

IF YOU DO NOT WISH TO ACCEPT YOUR PLACE:

If you decide not to accept your offer, please send an email stating this to fremantle.admissions@nd.edu.au and include your student number.

IF YOU WISH TO DEFER YOUR PLACE:

1. Accept your place by completing the Conditions of Offer and Acceptance Form.

2. Complete the Request for Deferred Commencement Form. Return it to us before the commencement of the semester.

These both need to be returned to the Admissions Office as soon as possible. You will be sent a letter within two weeks indicating whether or not the deferral has been approved.

You can defer for 6 or 12 months.

IF YOU ARE NOT SURE WHETHER YOU TO ACCEPT YOUR OFFER:

We understand that going to university is a big decision and you may need more than 14 days to consider your options. In this circumstance we recommend that you hold your place by:

1. Accepting your place by completing the Conditions of Offer and Acceptance Form. If you decide to come to the University, you need to attend an Enrolment Day.

If you decide not to accept your offer, you need to send an email stating this to fremantle.admissions@nd.edu.au.

2. Entire Agreement

The conditions set out in the Letter of Offer received from the University form part of these Conditions of Offer and Acceptance. These Conditions of Offer and Acceptance override any previous statements, undertakings or representations whether oral or in writing, which have been made by any University employee, agent or contractor prior to this offer. I declare that all information included in my application is factually correct and fairly presented. I understand that if any of the information I have included in my application is found to be false, the University reserves the right to vary or reverse any decision made in regards to my application or enrolment. I also understand that the University reserves the right to provide details of the false information to other universities or educational institutions or any other authority which the University considers it appropriate to inform.

3. University Regulations

I undertake to observe the Statutes, Regulations, Policies, Procedures and Code of Conduct of the University as varied, replaced or introduced from time to time. Without limiting the above, I understand that to complete a course or program, I must attend prescribed classes, lectures, seminars, tutorials, practical and clinical practice; complete the prescribed work of the program or course at a satisfactory standard; and pass prescribed examinations. I agree that I must give notice in writing to the Registrar by the date specified if I want to withdraw from a program or course or take leave of absence. I understand that if I do not give the required notice I will have to pay the full amount of fees and a 'Fail' grade will be recorded against my enrolled courses. I understand that the University reserves the right to change the content and/or method of assessment of any course of study, to withdraw any course of study or program which it offers and to impose limitations on enrolment in any course or program.

4. Payment of fees

At The University of Notre Dame Australia your tuition fees vary depending upon your program and the courses you take within that program. All courses are allocated a study load and a discipline area. The fees shown in this document are indicative of a full-time study load in the specified discipline areas. Fees will vary based on the number and type of courses chosen. Programs that have an overload component will attract higher annual fees. The tuition rates in this document are the indicative annual rates that apply to study undertaken in 2019.

HOW FEES ARE CALCULATED

Fees are calculated based on the discipline and study load of the courses undertaken by students. For the majority of programs, courses studied do not all fall within the same discipline. For example, if you are enrolled in a Bachelor of Education, you may undertake some courses that are classified as 'education' and some that are classified as 'humanities'. In this example your student contribution for the humanities courses will be calculated against the Humanities discipline, while the education courses will be calculated against the Education discipline.

PRE-UNIVERSITY PROGRAMS

Students undertaking the Tertiary Pathway Program (TPP) and who are awarded a Commonwealth Supported Place will pay no fees on submission of a HECS-HELP form. Students awarded a Fee Paying place may pay upfront or if eligible access FEE-HELP.

COMMONWEALTH SUPPORTED PLACES

The following discipline rates apply to all students awarded a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP). Subject to availability it is expected that most students enrolled in Education (Pre-service), Health & Physical Education, Health Sciences, Medicine, Nursing and Physiotherapy will be allocated a Commonwealth Supported Place. These fees are aligned with the student contribution rates set by the Australian Government.

HOW WILL I PAY?

Students who are Australian Citizens, holders of Permanent Humanitarian Visas and eligible New Zealand Citizens who wish to defer their fees, have access to the Australian Government's HELP loan schemes HECS-HELP and FEE-HELP. The HECS-HELP loan scheme assists eligible students, who have been allocated a Commonwealth Supported Place, in paying their tuition fees. The FEE-HELP loan scheme assists eligible students, who have been allocated a Fee Paying Place, in paying their tuition fees. Repayments in both schemes can be deferred until students are in the workforce. Students should consult www.studyassist.gov.au for further information and up to date eligibility requirements.

These fees are indicative and may vary with the mix of units selected. Fee levels vary from year to year and the University makes no guarantee that the current fee levels will be maintained in future.

Students who elect to take up the FEE-HELP loan scheme are required to pay back the cost of their units of study plus indexation in line with the CPI. From semester 1, 2019, commencing students studying an undergraduate program at the University will no longer be charged the 25% FEE-HELP loan fee.
