

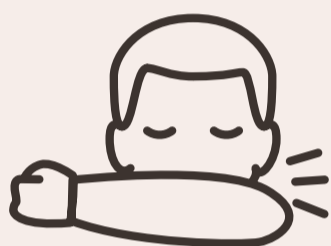


Who should get tested for COVID-19?

Anyone with COVID-19 symptoms should be tested. Symptoms include:



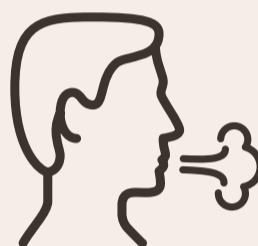
fever (37.5 ° or higher)



cough



sore throat



shortness of breath (difficulty breathing)



loss of taste



loss of smell

Other reported symptoms of COVID-19 include **fatigue, runny nose, muscle pain, joint pain, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting and loss of appetite.**

Testing is especially important for:

- people who are close contacts of a confirmed case
- people who have returned from overseas or Victoria in the last 14 days
- people who reside in areas of increased testing and surveillance or have visited hotspots
- people who live or work in a high risk setting (e.g. healthcare facilities, aged care and other residential facilities, and schools)

Special circumstances

If you are part of a public health unit outbreak investigation, you need to be tested.
