Bachelor of Nursing (Enrolled Nurse Articulation Pathway)

Are you an enrolled nurse (Division 2) who would like to qualify as a registered nurse?

The University of Notre Dame Australia recognises the skills and knowledge gained in your previous studies and clinical practice. We offer a pathway for enrolled nurses to gain advanced standing for the Bachelor of Nursing and complete the degree in a reduced timeframe.

Who is this program for?

This pathway is designed for enrolled nurses (Division 2) who would like to further their studies with a Bachelor of Nursing and become registered nurses.

To be eligible for admission through this pathway applicants must:

- ✓ have completed a Diploma of Nursing (HLT54121 or HLT54115) accredited by the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council in the previous six years
- ✓ be registered with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (Ahpra) as an enrolled nurse (Division 2) with no conditions on their registration
- ✓ meet the University's general requirements for admission to the degree.

When granting admission and credit we consider your enrolled nurse qualifications and registration, and how recently you have practised.

Why study this program?

- ✓ Your existing skills and knowledge will be recognised with up to 200 units of credit (equivalent to one year of full-time study) granted as advanced standing.
- ✓ You can complete your Bachelor of Nursing in as little as two years full time – one year less than normal.
- ✓ You'll benefit from a dedicated orientation for enrolled nurses (EN Primer Week), which will prepare you for university study.
- ✓ Upon graduation, you'll be eligible to apply to become a registered nurse with Ahpra.
- ✓ You can take advantage of flexible study options so you can continue to work while studying.

Study mode and courses

Before commencing the Bachelor of Nursing, you'll attend the compulsory EN Primer Week. This week (which includes one day on campus and four days online) features a series of lectures, tutorials and activities providing you with the academic skills to integrate directly into the second year of the degree. You'll have opportunities to network with peers and learn from mentors.

You'll then complete your studies in four stages (stages 3 to 6 of the Bachelor of Nursing). Each stage includes four to five courses studied per semester if enrolled on a full-time basis.

Courses include on-campus learning (lectures, tutorials and labs) and professional practice placements in a range of clinical settings.

The program can be completed in two years full time or four years part time.
