Academic Integrity policy and procedure

The new Academic Integrity policy and procedure apply to:

- staff of the University, including adjuncts and clinical academics
- students of the University (including former students)
- students enrolled in a program or course delivered by a third party
- academic visitors to the University
- anyone who undertakes research on behalf of the University.

The changes introduce new and updated principles and requirements for:

- Education of students and staff about academic integrity and the prevention of academic cheating
- Classifying of levels of academic integrity breach
- o Penalties to be applied for breaches considered as student misconduct
- Managing suspected breaches involving contract cheating
- o breaches of academic integrity, and
- Monitoring and improving the mitigation of academic integrity risks.

The new policy and procedure replace the rescinded *Policy: Academic Integrity (Staff)*, *Policy: Academic Integrity (Students)*, and *Procedure: Managing Breaches of Academic Integrity (Students)*.

Principles and requirements for maintaining research integrity (responsible research conduct and practice) continue to be defined in the *Code of Conduct Research* and the *Procedure: Managing Potential Breaches of the Code of Conduct Research*.

Principles and requirements for staff to manage potential conflicts of interest that relate to maintaining academic integrity are set out in the *Staff Code of Conduct*.
