Tips to making sure that you're on the right track before you start

Enrol in your courses and complete your timetable. Enrol in your courses and sign up to your timetable. See instructions on <u>signing up your timetable</u> . If you have any queries regarding what to enrol in, you should contact your school. Tip - some units (courses) may include a lecture, workshops, laboratories and placements, so be mindful that you need to schedule these into your timetable.
Check your UNDA email Access your email in your MyND Portal. Make sure that you check your email regularly. Visit getting started with IT for instructions.
Student ID and travel concession Student ID cards will allow you to prove your ID on campus and at exams, borrow books, and store money for printing. Go to Student Admin to get your Student ID card. Travel concessions are available for full-time students in Fremantle (Smartrider) and in Sydney (Opal Card Concessions).
Come to the Orientation Festival Meet other students from your degree, join a club, learn about our support services, and enjoy free food and entertainment!
Take a Campus tour Make sure that you know the location of your first class. Download the Fremantle Campus map Sydney Campus map - Broadway Sydney Campus map - Darlinghurst.

Check what support workshops are on offer in the first weeks of Uni. We offer academic, wellbeing, careers and loads of other workshops to help get you started at uni.
