## 4 OVERVIEW

## 4.1 Campus Availability

The Graduate Diploma of Writing has been approved for delivery on the Sydney Campus.

#### 4.2 Student Availability

The Graduate Diploma of Writing is available for enrolment to domestic Students.

#### 4.3 Australian Qualifications Framework

The Graduate Diploma of Writing is accredited by the University as a Level 8 qualification.

#### 4.4 Duration

The Volume of Learning for the Graduate Diploma of Writing is one (1) year of equivalent full-time study.

An option to complete this Program Part-time is available.

#### 4.5 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Graduate Diploma of Writing Award is four (4) years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

#### 4.6 Study Mode

The Graduate Diploma of Writing is offered in Internal Study Mode.

- 150 Units of Credit from six (6) elective courses listed in Appendix A.
