### Learning Mode

This program is offered in a blended mode, which includes a mixture of online learning and face to face clinical skills workshops, lectures and tutorials. The first 3 weeks of the semester include an intensive on campus study block (either Fremantle, Sydney, Broome or Melbourne) dependent on where you enrol followed by another block of online study during the semester. Your calendar and program planner will be emailed to you. But please note that the Graduate Diploma of Midwifery Program commences prior to the usual university semester dates.

### Professional Practice

In order to attend Professional Practice students are required to have the following:

- WA, NSW or VIC Department of Health Criminal Screening Check
- National Police Clearance Check
- Basic Life Support
- Manual Handling
- Working with Children Check
- Current Immunisations including;
  - Tuberculosis
  - MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) ○ Varicella
  - DTP (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis) ○ Hepatitis A (including serology) ○ Hepatitis B (including serology)
  - Influenza
  - MRSA (if you have worked or been a patient in a hospital outside of WA in the past 12 months)
  - COVID (double) vaccination (and booster dose if eligible)

### **Additional Professional Practice Costs**

#### *Travel to Practicum Placements*

Students are responsible for paying the transport costs to and from all practicum placements, including Continuity-of-Care Experience appointments. Any parking fees that are incurred are also the responsibility of the student.

#### *Uniforms*

Students are required to wear the Midwifery uniform or polo shirt for all Continuity-of-Care Experience (CCE) appointments and all Professional Practice placements. Uniforms can be ordered online, and must be ordered as soon as you have accepted your offer, as they may take a few weeks to be manufactured. Contact details for the suppliers will be made available to you. The cost of one uniform set (top and pants) is approximately \$100 and the polo shirt around \$30. Fully enclosed, waterproof black or blue shoes must be worn.
