3 PURPOSE

These Program Requirements set out the approved requirements for the Graduate Certificate in Writing.

4 OVERVIEW

4.1 Campus Availability

The Graduate Certificate in Writing has been approved for delivery on the Sydney Campus.

4.2 Student Availability

The Graduate Certificate in Writing is available for enrolment to domestic Students.

4.3 Australian Qualifications Framework

The Graduate Certificate in Writing is accredited by the University as a Level 8 qualification.

4.4 Duration

The Volume of Learning for the Graduate Certificate in Writing is half a year (0.5 years) of equivalent full-time study.

An option to complete this Program Part-time is available.

4.5 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Graduate Certificate in Writing Award is 3 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

4.6 Study Mode

The Graduate Certificate in Writing is offered in Internal Study Mode.

4.7 Professional Accreditation

There are no professional accreditation requirements applicable to this Program.

5 ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

5.1 University Admission Requirements

This program allows students to build on skills and knowledge they have gained through their undergraduate study or acquire new knowledge and skills in Writing as an interdisciplinary field.
