3 PURPOSE

These Program Requirements set out the approved requirements for the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology.

4 OVERVIEW

4.1 Campus Availability

The Bachelor of Arts in Psychology has been approved for delivery on the Fremantle and Sydney campuses.

4.2 Student Availability

The Bachelor of Arts in Psychology is available for enrolment to domestic Students and international Students with a student visa.

4.3 Australian Qualifications Framework

The Bachelor of Arts in Psychology is accredited by the University as a Level 7 AQF qualification.

4.4 Duration

(i) The Volume of Learning for the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology is three (3) years of equivalent full-time study.

(ii) An option to complete this Program part-time is available.

(iii) An accelerated option to complete the Program is not available.

4.5 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology Award is 8 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

4.6 Study Mode

The Bachelor of Arts in Psychology is offered in Internal Study mode.

4.7 Professional Accreditation

The Bachelor of Arts in Psychology is accredited with the Australian Psychology Accrediting Council (APAC) as a level 1 program for pathway to registration.

7 PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

7.1 Program Description

The Bachelor Arts in Psychology is a three-year program where students gain foundational knowledge and skills in psychology within a comprehensive liberal arts program. The program offers a deep conceptual and evidence-based understanding of the behaviour, cognitive functions, and emotional processes of human beings. Students explore how emotional and cognitive states influence individual development and behavior, and how these factors themselves can be influenced by physiological and biological processes. They are introduced to diagnosis and treatment of mental illness, while also examining scientific methods used to analyse a wide range of topics related to mental health and behavior. Students can complement their studies in psychology with an enriching range of second majors or minors which can broaden or deepen personal interests.

Bachelor of Arts in Psychology graduates think critically, creatively, and ethically to solve problems and are culturally and globally aware. They have research, interpersonal and communication skills and can work both autonomously and with others. They gain the knowledge and skills to apply theoretical, psychosocial, cognitive, and cultural perspectives and wellbeing models within a holistic framework to optimize wellbeing.

Graduates achieve the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council foundational competencies as a pathway for research, further learning and provisional registration.

7.2 Program Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the Bachelor of Arts graduates will be able to:

1. Demonstrate broad theoretical and practical knowledge, with depth in the principles, theories, concepts, and methodologies of psychology;
2. Select and apply appropriate theory and methods to evaluate evidence, make recommendations and draw conclusions to problems;
3. Apply knowledge and skills in a manner that is ethical, reflexive, culturally appropriate and responsive to the diversity of human persons;
4. Communicate insights safely and effectively in a range of formats to diverse audiences;
5. Work independently and in collaboration with others.

7.3 Required Courses

To be eligible for the Award of Bachelor of Arts in Psychology students must complete a minimum of 600 Units of Credit, which includes the following required and elective courses:

- 50 Units of Credit from two (2) Core Curriculum Courses;
- 25 Units of Credit from one (1) required Course;
- 250 Units of Credit from ten (10) compulsory Psychology Courses; and
- 275 Units of Credit from eleven (11) elective Courses, which may be used to form a Second Major or Minor.

7.4 Elective Courses

Any of the following elective Courses may be completed in the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology, where prerequisites and admission requirements allow:

- (i) Courses that are available in any of the Majors, Minors or Specialisations of this Program, or that are offered by the School of Arts and Sciences and listed in Appendix C;
- (ii) Courses taken by cross-institutional enrolment, including Study Abroad, as approved by the Head of School; and
- (iii) Up to 100 Units of Credit from general electives, including those from other Schools.

7.5 First-Year Courses

Students may not complete more than ten (10) 1000-level Courses in this Program, including those credited by Advanced Standing.

7.6 Honours
