Among the core requirements of Riverina Regional Training Hub (RRTH) are identifying university-level medical students and junior doctors with an interest in rural practice, and providing them with support including assistance with career planning, placement opportunities and access to mentoring and also to identify areas of regional medical workforce need within their catchment area, and work to build medical training capacity in these areas.

To this end the RRTH in 2020 is able to provide some support to medical students and junior doctors to attend approved conferences that support their continuing professional Further information development. may be found on the RRTH webpage. We welcomed our new Hub Clinical Director, Prof Michael Brydon in August. Michael is also the new Dean of the Notre Dame School of Medicine, Sydney Rural Clinical School. Prof Brydon replaced Dr Joe McGirr, now the state member for Wagga Wagga.

The RRTH and the USYD RTHs launched a podcast series in November 2019. **Destination Medicine**® has been developed for high school students, medical students and trainee dotors, anyone in fact interested in rural medicine. The podcasts share young rural doctors' stories, telling the sometimes funny, often inspiring tales of how they have come to be living and working where they are. A second **Destination Medicine** podcast series commencing in February will feature Dr Sean Hogan, who was dragged "kicking and screaming" to regional NSW. To his surprise he has followed rural study and training with a career in rural Psychiatry.

In the last quarter of 2019 the RRTH began to work closely with the MLHD and other rural health partners to increase the number of **short term placements** available for medical students not already based here. This has lead in the last four months to an additional seventeen placements in hospitals and general practices. As a senior MLHD staff member said this week welcoming a med student and student midwife "a great recruitment opportunity".

Twenty eight new junior doctors started at the Wagga Wagga Base Hospital on 20 January. The RRTH time introduced the national Regional Training Hub program, the two local RTH and briefly explaining our role. We are excited to be supporting these new rural doctors through both their Residents Medical Officer Association (RMOA) and individually to find their own pathways in rural medicine. At the Notre Dame Rural Clinical we welcomed eight third year medical students, three of whom have moved with their families. They join eight fourth year students already at the RCS for 2020.
