## 3 PURPOSE

These Program Requirements set out the approved requirements for the Master of Divinity.

## 4 OVERVIEW

#### 4.1 Campus Availability

The Master of Divinity has been approved for delivery on the Catholic Institute of Sydney and Sydney campuses.

## 4.2 Student Availability

The Master of Divinity is available for enrolment to domestic Students and all international and offshore Students.

#### 4.3 Australian Qualifications Framework

The Master of Divinity is accredited by the University as a Level 9 AQF qualification.

#### 4.4 Duration

The Volume of Learning for the Master of Divinity is three (3) years of equivalent full-time study.

An option to complete this Program Part-time is available.

#### 4.5 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Master of Divinity Award is 8 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

#### 4.6 Study Mode

The Master of Divinity is offered in Internal, External, Multimode and Online Study mode.

#### 4.7 Professional Accreditation

There are no professional accreditation requirements applicable to this Program.

## 5 ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

### 5.1 University Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission to The University of Notre Dame Australia, all applicants must meet the <u>University's minimum requirements for admission</u>. The requirements for admission are detailed in the University's Policy: *Admissions*.

## 5.2 Specific Program Requirements for Admission

- 5.2.1 Students who have completed the BDiv at UNDA are able to earn the MDiv in 400 credit points (2 years). Such students may select from any level 5000 courses on offer but may not select a course that covers the same content area at AQF Level 9 of a course that they have studied at AQF Level 7.
- 5.2.2 For students without the prior study in the English language, IELTS of 7.0 in all bands.

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# 7 PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

## 7.1 Program Description

The Master of Divinity is a foundational three-year AQF9 level degree from the University of Notre Dame Australia open to students at the Catholic Institute of Sydney. It is designed to provide students with advanced knowledge in philosophy, Sacred Scripture, Catholic theology, and associated disciplines. The Master of Divinity develops in graduates advanced knowledge and skills across a range of theological and related disciplines and deeper knowledge and skills in at least one discipline. It develops communication skills, both oral and written, and advanced research skills. The Master of Divinity can also serve as a pathway to further study and/or as a framework for professional ministry training.

# 7.2 Program Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the Master of Divinity graduates will be able to:

- Integrate an extended knowledge of the Catholic faith, achieved through detailed study of the theological disciplines and Sacred Scripture, supported by philosophy, as a basis for independent research and lifelong learning;
- 2. Demonstrate mastery of theological perspectives and methods and research principles, evident in honed cognitive skills, applied in the light of Catholic faith, across all the main theological disciplines;
- 3. Analyse and synthesise complex information, methods, and theories in a manner that demonstrates advanced theological and/or ministerial competence, using cognitive, technical, and creative skills;
- 4. Communicate complex theological and pastoral insights, obtained via research, in a succinct, contextualised and doctrinally coherent way, to specialist and non-specialist audiences;
- 5. Adapt knowledge and skills to act with competence, creativity, autonomy, and ethical responsibility in their Christian living in the world.

#### 7.3 Required Courses

To be eligible for the award of Master of Divinity students must complete a minimum of 600 Units of Credit chosen from the courses listed in Appendix E comprising:

- At least 50 credits in Philosophy
- 2. At least 100 credits in each of Sacred Scripture
  - a. Including at least 25 credits in each of Old and New Testament Studies
- At least 100 credits in Dogmatic Theology
- 4. Either Sacred Scripture or Dogmatic Theology needs to be extended to 150 credits
- 5. At least 25 credits in Moral Theology
- 6. At least 25 credits in Pastoral Studies and Practice
- 7. At least 25 credits in Church History and Patrology
- 8. At least 25 credits in a research project (unless an HDR pathway is chosen)
- 9. 200 credits in electives
- 10. No more than 250 credits from any discipline
- 11. No more than 300 credits at level 5100
- 12. At least 150 credits at level 5300

#### Pathway to HDR

This pathway is offered only in Sacred Scripture or Dogmatic Theology. A student needs a GPA of 2+ across the program plus a WAM of 70% or better, on the UNDA marking scale, in the nominated field to be accepted.

Students may elect to take this pathway no later than the second year of the program. They then choose a specified option comprising 150 (one hundred and fifty) units of credit:

Opting for this pathway option takes place in consultation with the Academic Dean of the Catholic Institute of Sydney.

If a student is accepted to the HDR pathway, then the student takes 150 credit points comprising:

50 credits from level 6000 units cognate to the intended area of research, or other units identified by the Dean at CIS as suitable;

25 credits in the Research Methods and Thesis Proposal course; and,

75 credit minor thesis.

To be eligible to apply to the ThD (Doctorate of Theology), one needs Distinction grades or higher in all courses of the pathway.

Credit grades or above are needed to be eligible to apply for the MPhil.

To be eligible to apply for the ThD after taking the BDiv and MDiv, a student needs to have:

- Completed 25 units of credit in the course CISR6300 Research Training and Thesis Proposal
- Completed 75 units of credit in the course CISR6310 Supervised Thesis
- Achieved at least Distinction grades in all courses of the pathway
- Achieved a WAM of at least 70% in the discipline within the BDiv and MDiv

## 7.4 Elective Courses

Students enrolled in the Master of Divinity are required to complete 200 units of credit in electives according to the discipline areas specified at 7.3.

Elective courses can be selected from the approved list of course offerings listed in Appendix E.

#### 7.5 Course substitutions

Course substitutions, where permitted, must be approved by the Academic Dean of the Catholic Institute of Sydney (CIS).
