Graduate Certificate in Education (Early Childhood)

School of Education, Fremantle Campus

The Graduate Certificate in Education (Early Childhood) enables primary qualified teachers to gain a professional accreditation to work in the early school years. The program, which consists of five courses, includes 12 weeks of practical teaching experience across both childcare and school settings. The program is equivalent to 0.75 of a full-time load and will take approximately 18 months to complete, depending on the course offerings each year.

Why study this degree?

Are you a four-year trained teacher who would like to know more about Early Childhood education? Our Graduate Certificate in Education (Early Childhood), which uses a combination of face-to-face classes and online

tuition, provides specialised study for those wishing to develop their skills and qualifications to teach in the early years.

This postgraduate program covers topics such as Holistic Development in Early Childhood, Early Childhood Curriculum Development, Trends in Early Childhood Development and Teaching, and Integration in Early Childhood Education. If you do not have any prior training in Early Childhood Education, you will also be required to complete a practical component. This involves two weeks with babies and toddlers (aged 0-2 years) within a childcare context and 10 weeks with children aged 3-5 years within a school or childcare setting.

Graduates of this program may choose to enrol for a Master's at Notre Dame.

Program summary

Students may commence in Summer Term (January), in Semester 1 (February) or April Intensive, in Winter Term (July), in Semester 2 (July) or October Intensive, subject to course availability.

Entry requirements

A student applying for the Graduate Certificate in Early Childhood Education should:

- Hold the equivalent of a four year primary teaching qualification;
- Hold a Teacher Registration; and
- Have a minimum of three years' teaching experience
