Why study this degree?

The Master of Health Professional Education (Coursework and thesis) will give you the qualifications and skills to become an educator in the complex health arena. This course considers your multiple current responsibilities and recognises how difficult it can be to find adequate time to further your education.

In addition to the courses studied, you conduct research in a particular area of interest. To ensure you engage in high-quality research, you are introduced to the key components of preparing and writing a research proposal.

Program summary

The Health Professional Education (coursework and thesis) masters is a thesis-based research degree. Students will be required to complete four coursework courses prior to the commencement of supervised research.

Supervision

As a Masters by Research candidate, you are required to have a minimum of two supervisors who will provide support and academic guidance throughout your degree. Your supervisors will assist you with the preparation of your research proposal, continuing to mentor and direct you throughout the research phase and through the process of examination.

Mode of Study and Assessment

The program is available only in a part-time capacity. The standard time for completion (not including periods of approved leave of absence) is normally three years for a part-time student. Once completed, your Masters thesis will be assessed by two external examiners.

Entry requirements

- Bachelor degree in a health related field
- Active involvement in health professional education
