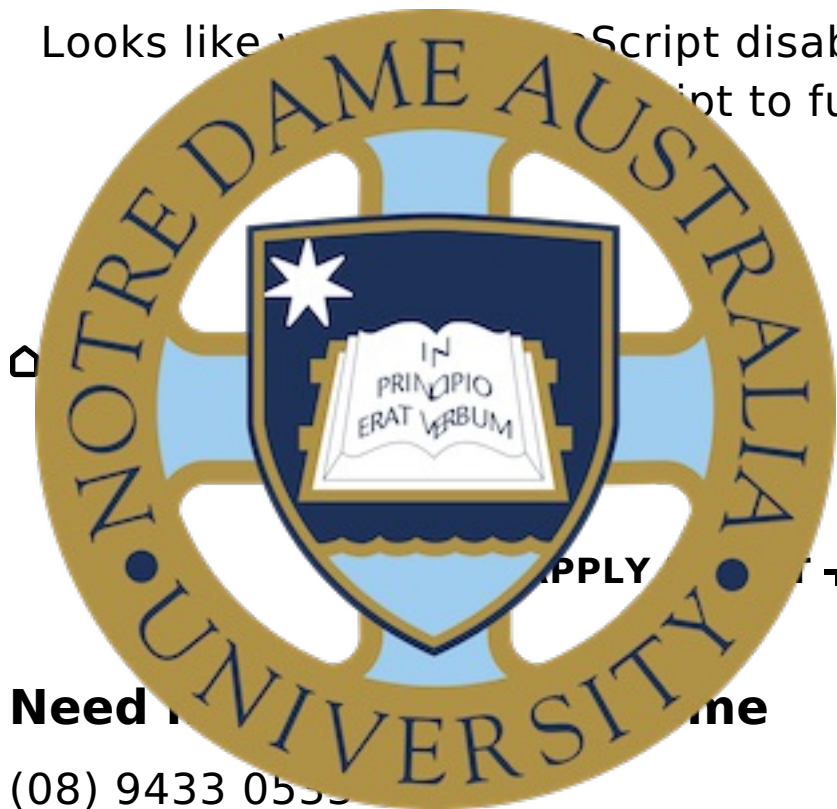

Are you a Registered Nurse who wishes to advance your career? The Master of Nursing (Research) at The University of Notre Dame Australia will suit you if you have achieved a high credit average in your undergraduate nursing degree and wish to complete further research in an area of particular interest. To graduate, you must complete a substantial research project culminating in a thesis. You will be supported by academic staff throughout your master's program. Contact us today to find out more.

Why study this degree?

Available as a full-time program across two calendar years (or equivalent part-time), our Master of Nursing (Research) will provide you with the research skills you need to support your professional practice. Topics covered include literature review, research methodology, ethics, analysis, verification and report writing. Furthermore, the program consists of several supervised research subjects, including research coursework as appropriate.

You will be expected to complete a substantial research project culminating in a thesis. Candidates will be assigned university-based supervisors who will provide support and academic guidance. Your supervisor will mentor and direct your studies throughout the research phase until your thesis is put forward for examination. Government support is available for domestic and international students, while domestic students may also apply for stipend scholarships awarded to students of exceptional potential.

Program summary

This Master's program consists of several courses of supervised research. The duration of the program is two years full-time or the equivalent of part-time study.

Entry requirements

In order to be considered for entry, applicants are expected to satisfy the following criteria:

- Current license to practice as a Registered Nurse within Australia or provisional registration whichever is applicable at the time of the students program commencement; or
- Applicants who do not meet the requirements of the clause above, but are able to demonstrate equivalent international experience satisfy the criteria. In these circumstances, an applicant's research topic may be limited to a non-clinical setting; and
- Bachelor of Nursing or other appropriate degree; and
- Minimum of two years relevant post registration nursing experience, or as acceptable by the program coordinator; and
- An applicant may be required to satisfy the Dean of the School of Nursing and Midwifery of the ability to understand and communicate in both written and spoken English at a level adequate for the purpose of pursuing the program of study.

Learning outcomes

Upon successful completion of the Master of Nursing (Research), graduates will be able to:

1. Analyse and interpret nursing scenarios to provide evidence based quality practice
2. Use reflective practice techniques in a range of learning

activities to promote professional practice

3. Apply leadership and collaborative skills within an interprofessional health care environment
4. Apply concepts of global, medico-legal, social and cultural diversity
5. Identify the distinguishing characteristics of nursing research in terms of purposes, underlying assumptions and available methodologies
6. Explore the principal paradigms employed in health and nursing research and differentiate between them in terms of their epistemological bases, their respective strengths and limitations in addressing different types of research
7. Formulate questions amenable to research and align those questions to appropriate research designs, data collection procedures, techniques and data analysis
8. Critique examples of research studies and models, identifying strengths and limitations of design that might threaten the internal validity and generalisability (external validity) of the findings
9. Identify the important ethical or other issues when conducting nursing research and apply value appropriate safeguards to the interests of all stake-holders involved a research project; and
10. Apply advanced technical skills and reflective practice within the domain of nursing research.

Career opportunities

With a Master of Nursing (Research), you can pursue careers as a nurse unit manager, nurse practitioner, nurse educator, clinical nurse, acute care nurse or perioperative nurse.

Real-world experience

You will learn from our academics, who are leaders in their field. There are no practicum requirements for this program.
