Entry requirements

To be eligible for admission to the Master of Education (Curriculum), applicants must also meet the following specific requirements:

- Be eligible for teacher registration in Australia; and either
- Successfully complete the University of Notre Dame Australia Graduate Certificate of Education (Curriculum) or equivalent; or
- Have at least two years of full-time professional experience in either a primary or secondary school setting.

Learning outcomes Upon successful completion of the Master of Education (Curriculum) graduates will be able to:

- L. Critically apply and reflect on advanced knowledge and understandings of specialised educational theory and practices within the domain of curriculum studies
- Demonstrate highly developed cognitive, technical and creative skills with initiative, a high level of personal autonomy and accountability to generate understanding of complex issues in religious education
- Evaluate and apply knowledge of research principles and methods to curriculum studies within school contexts
- Demonstrate highly developed communication and technical skills to implement, justify and interpret critical issues in curriculum planning and design within educational contexts
- Plan, execute and reflect critically on a substantial research-based project and/or piece of scholarship on critical issues in curriculum studies within school

settings.

With a Master of Education (Curriculum), you will be able to work in Catholic, Government and Independent schools in roles such as curriculum and instruction specialist, curriculum design manager, education specialist, head of a learning area and principal leadership.
