Why study this degree

Are you looking for a demanding postgraduate degree that is highly regarded in the world of education? The Master of Teaching (Primary) fits the bill perfectly as it not only covers a wide range of academic subjects, but also provides students with 20 weeks of classroom experience. On graduation you are accredited to teach in Catholic, Government and Independent primary schools in WA.

Open to anyone with a Bachelor's degree from a recognised university, this Master's program consists of 24 courses covering subjects such as drama, science, dance, visual arts, English, mathematics and physical education, plus specialist instruction in religious education, working with Indigenous students and classroom management. You are also expected to undertake 10 weeks of classroom based practicum during each year, in addition to a Core Curriculum course in Theology or Ethics.

Entry requirements

Academic requirements for admission to the Master of Teaching (Primary) are:

- This award is only available to those who hold a recognised Bachelor Degree.
- Education students who have English as an Additional language and are admitted on the basis of an International Language Testing System (IELTS) assessment, or an equivalent English language proficiency assessment, are only admitted if they have attained an overall IELTS (or equivalent) score of 8.0 (with no score below 7.0 in any of the four skills areas and a score of no less than 8.0 in speaking and listening).

Learning outcomes Upon successful completion of the Master of Teaching (Primary Education) graduates will be able to:

- Apply an advanced and integrated understanding of the complex body of knowledge within the curriculum as prescribed through curricular, policy and accreditation bodies
- Research and apply established theories for planning and implementing teaching and learning engagements for children of diverse backgrounds and abilities based on sound understandings of pedagogy that draw on such research and theory
- 3. Synthesise learning gained from applying on-campus studies of research-based theory in multiple, varied and extended Professional Experience opportunities with accomplished teachers in a mentoring context within classrooms and schools
- I. Apply an advanced and integrated understanding of child development for the physical, social, cognitive, emotional, and cultural domains that will enable

- Demonstrate research capacity by planning and executing a research-based project.

Practicum

As a student studying the Master of Teaching (Primary Education) you are required to complete a minimum of 20 weeks of practicum that is comprised of:

- EDUC5370 Professional Experience 1 Master of Teaching Primary (10 continuous weeks in duration – 400 hrs)
- EDUC5389 Professional Experience 2 Master of Teaching Primary (10 continuous weeks in duration – 400 hrs)

Students are required to provide relevant clearance documents as directed by the School of Education

Career opportunities

With a Master of Teaching (Primary Education), you can teach primary students in Australian Catholic, Independent and Government schools. Career opportunities within the education system include Lead teacher, faculty or year group coordinator, principal, and assistant principal.

Real-world experience

You will learn from academics who are industry leaders, and through our practicum placements, you will gain real professional experience and make valuable contacts with potential employers.

Professional accreditation

The Master of Teaching (Primary Education) is accredited by the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL) via its agency the Teacher Registration Board of Western Australia (TRBWA).

Fees and costs

This Program has the following loan scheme(s) available for eligible students:

Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP)

A Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP) is a place at a university where the Australian Government pays part of your fees. This part is a subsidy, not a loan, and you don't have to pay it back. However, this subsidy does not cover the entire cost of your study. Students must pay the rest, which is called the 'student contribution amount'.

In a Commonwealth Supported Place, your fees are subsidised by the Australian Government. Your fees will be split into two portions:

The Commonwealth contribution, which is the portion paid by the Australian Government.

The student contribution, which is the portion you pay. You may choose to pay upfront or defer your student contribution with a HECS-HELP Loan. The HECS-HELP loan scheme (https://www.studyassist.gov.au/preview-link/node/106/5de65e70-6656-4297-a79d-19fd4a6deadd) assists eligible students with the payment of all, or part, of their tuition fees, not including additional study costs such as accommodation or textbooks. Your HECS-HELP debt will be indexed each year in line with the Consumer Price Index.

Eligible students will be offered a CSP – you do not need to apply.

International Full-Fee Paying

Tuition costs depend on an international student's study load and discipline. Fees are payable each semester at least four weeks prior to the commencement of your program.
