The Graduate Certificate in Sport and Educational Performance provides teachers a thorough introduction to the theory and practice around athlete and student development. This program will appeal to students who aspire to senior coaching or senior management positions in schools or with sporting clubs.

Why study this degree?

The Graduate Certificate in Sport and Educational Performance is designed to meet the needs of professional teachers who wish to undertake further career

development. Specifically, the program will support students to develop a comprehensive and ethical knowledge of athlete development and training prescription with the goal to enhance athletic performance. Unique to this program, students will also learn about pastoral care in the school, and how to mentor and coach peers in an educational setting in order to support personal and academic development.

- Mentoring and Coaching Graduate, Early Careers and Established Teachers
- Leading Pastoral Care in Education
