Upon graduation, you can take a Master of Nursing (Clinical Nursing), which requires a further two semesters of part-time study.

Master of Nursing (Clinical Nursing)

Entry requirements

The following entry requirements apply to this program:

- Current license to practice as a Registered Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia or provisional registration, whichever is applicable at the time of commencement
- Nursing or other appropriate degree or the equivalent
- Minimum of one year relevant post registration nursing experience
- Candidates must be employed with a participating health service provider and have their hospital's support to undertake the program.

- Implement advanced practice knowledge, skills and competencies that enhance their capacity to work safely and effectively in a dynamic and challenging healthcare environment in the hospital and community
