Entry requirements

The following entry requirements apply to this program:

- Current license to practice as a Registered Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia or provisional registration, whichever is applicable at the time of commencement
- Nursing of other appropriate degree or the equivalent
- Minimum of one year relevant post registration nursing experience.

Learning outcomes Upon successful completion of the Graduate Diploma of Nursing, graduates will be able to:

- Synthesise advanced theoretical knowledge and skills required of the Registered Nurse to undertake increasingly complex nursing activities
- Critique the effectiveness of national and international models of nursing practice and policy to continually improve outcomes for patients in the hospital and community
- Employ critical thinking and clinical reasoning to solve ethical and legal dilemmas in the culturally and socially diverse healthcare environment
- I. Communicate and negotiate with influence to achieve optimum patient care outcomes
- Collaborate with a range of professionals to achieve the common goals of best possible healthcare outcomes for individuals and communities
- Reflect on practice to facilitate awareness and knowledge of one's own cognition and abilities, establishing a mechanism for lifelong learning

- Actively contribute to the professional development of a range of members of the healthcare team; and
