Entry requirements

The following entry requirements apply to this program:

- Current license to practice as a Registered Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia or provisional registration, whichever is applicable at the time of commencement
- Nursing of other appropriate degree or the equivalent
- Minimum of one year relevant post registration nursing experience
- Currently working as a Registered Nurse in the perioperative environment of a partnership facility
- Current employment contract for the term of the

program with an approved health service.

Learning outcomes Upon successful completion of the Graduate Diploma of Perioperative Nursing, graduates will be able to:

- Demonstrate knowledge of concepts and principles framing perioperative nursing care
- Apply advanced technical competence in perioperative nursing, with demonstration of portability of learning from one specialty to another
