Paediatric Basics in Acute Care

Are you a Health Professional looking to refresh and develop your skills?

Description

This course is aims to provide participants with an overview of the differences between paediatric and adult patients, assessment using the ABCDE approach and other considerations including non-accidental injury. The management of paediatric conditions including asthma, croup, bronchiolitis, sepsis, anaphylaxis, and seizures will be discussed utilising recommendations from Royal Childrens Hospital guidelines, APLS guidelines and other contemporary sources. Medication and fluid dosing and safe administration will also be discussed.

The course consists of an eight-hour, online workshop with an optional two-hour, self-directed online activity package to cover concepts unable to be accommodated by the workshop schedule. Pre-course activity access and online meeting details will be emailed to participants approximately two weeks prior to the course date. Precourse activity access will be deactivated the day following the course.

This course is suitable for any health professionals (including students) who would like to know more about paediatric patient assessment and management. There are no prerequisites or previous experience required to attend.

 Determine anatomical and physiological considerations for paediatric patients at each stage of the ABCDE assessment approach and the impact these have upon a child during times of illness and injury

- Apply the paediatric assessment triangle and ABCDE approach to the assessment of paediatric patients
- Explain common assessment findings for various childhood illnesses and relate these to the pathophysiology of the condition
- Identify 'red flags' for non-accidental injury in paediatric patients and take appropriate action within scope of practice and workplace role
- Demonstrate effective use of paediatric medication resources, fluid charts and other tools to ensure safe medication and fluid administration practices
- Demonstrate effective understanding and use of cognitive aids and algorithms relevant to paediatric illness management

Cancellations

Cancellation of registrations by registrants can be completed through contacting postgraduatenursing@nd.edu.au (mailto:postgraduatenursing@nd.edu.au). A full refund can be provided if cancellation occurs outside of the minimum cancellation period outlined for the course which is 6 weeks. The minimum cancellation period is measured in days prior to the course commencement date.

If cancellation occurs within the stipulated minimum cancellation period, the candidate will not receive any refund unless the course place is taken by another

participant. The candidate will not be able to transfer to another course without full payment for the future course unless the course place is taken by another participant.
