3 PURPOSE

These Program Requirements set out the approved requirements for the Master in Health Leadership.

4 OVERVIEW

4.1 Campus Availability

The Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership, the Graduate Diploma of Health Leadership and the Master of Health Leadership has been approved for delivery on the Fremantle and Sydney Campus.

4.2 Student Availability

The Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership, the Graduate Diploma of Health Leadership and the Master of Health Leadership are available for enrolment to domestic and off-shore Students.

4.3 Australian Qualifications Framework

The Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership and the Graduate Diploma of Health Leadership are accredited by the University as a Level 8 AQF qualification. The Master of Health Leadership is accredited by the University as a Level 9 AQF qualification.

4.4 Duration

The Volume of Learning for the Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership is 0.5 years of equivalent full-time study.

The Volume of Learning for the Graduate Diploma of Health Leadership is 1 year of equivalent full-time study.

The Volume of Learning for the Master of Health Leadership is 1.5 years of equivalent full-time study.

A student is only able to enrol in the Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership Award on a part-time basis and can enrol in the Graduate Diploma and Master of Health Leadership full time.

4.5 Maximum Duration

- 4.5.1 The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership Award is 3 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.
- 4.5.2 The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Graduate Diploma of Health Leadership is 5 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.
- 4.5.3 The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Master of Health Leadership is 7 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

4.6 Study Mode

These awards are offered in Multimode and Online Study mode.

4.7 Professional Accreditation

There are no professional accreditation requirements applicable to this Program.

5 ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

5.1 University Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission to The University of Notre Dame Australia, all applicants must meet the <u>University's minimum requirements for admission</u>. The requirements for admission are detailed

in the University's Policy: Admissions.

5.2 Specific Program Requirements for Admission

To be eligible for admission to the **Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership** applicants must also meet the following specific requirements:

- As a minimum qualification, a recognised Bachelor degree in a health profession; or
- A Bachelor degree with evidence of specific professional and/or industry experience in health;
- Evidence of a senior management or leadership role in the health sector

To be eligible for admission to the **Graduate Diploma of Health Leadership** applicants must meet the following specific requirements:

- As a minimum qualification, a recognised Bachelor degree in a health profession; or
- A Bachelor degree with evidence of specific professional and/or industry experience in health.

To be eligible for admission to the **Master of Health Leadership** applicants must meet the following specific requirements:

- As a minimum qualification, a recognised Bachelor degree in a health profession; or
- A Bachelor degree with evidence of specific professional and/or industry experience in health.

6 PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

6.1 Program Description: Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership

The Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership supports health professionals who want to consolidate or further their leadership career. The program provides students with a comprehensive introduction to the core principles of management and leadership within the complex health arena, in which consumers and their significant others play a central role. Students complete two core courses to support their development as a health professional leader and undertake a significant workplace project to demonstrate application of learning.

Program Description: Graduate Diploma of Health Leadership

The Graduate Diploma of Health Leadership comprises a comprehensive overview of the core principles of management and leadership within the complex health arena, in which consumers and their significant others play a central role. Students complete three foundational courses focused on leadership theory, systems-focused thinking, and ethics for professional life, with a further three self-selected specialist courses.

Program Description: Master of Health Leadership

The Master of Health Leadership comprises a comprehensive overview of the core principles of management and leadership within the complex health arena, in which consumers and their significant others play a central role. Students complete three foundational courses focused on leadership theory, systems-focused thinking, and ethics for professional life, with a further three self-selected specialist courses, and a health leadership research study.

Master of Health Leadership

- 3) Interpret governance and risk as applied to the work context in consideration of management and leadership roles and responsibilities.
- 4) Employ critical reflection to encourage on-going learning to maintain and improve professional knowledge and skills.
- 5) Utilise a critical thinking approach to solve ethical dilemmas in the culturally and socially diverse healthcare environment.
- 6) Communicate and negotiate with influence to achieve optimum outcomes.
- 7) Apply oral presentation and report writing skills and apply these for the dissemination of project and research findings.
- 8) Use evidence-based research in preparation of professional analysis and advice.

6.3 Required Courses

To be eligible for the award of **Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership** students must complete a minimum of 100 Units of Credit consisting of the four (4) Compulsory courses listed in Appendix A.

To be eligible for the award of **Graduate Diploma of Health Leadership** students must complete a minimum of 150 Units of Credit consisting of the six (6) Compulsory Courses listed in Appendix A.

To be eligible for the award of **Master of Health Leadership** students must complete 250 Units of Credit consisting of the eight (8) Compulsory Courses listed in Appendix A.

6.4 Elective Courses

There are no elective courses in the Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership.

There are two (2) Elective Courses in the **Graduate Diploma of Health Leadership** giving 50 Units of Credit.

There are two (2) Elective Courses in the Master of Health Leadership giving 50 Units of Credit.

6.5 Nested Awards

To be eligible for the award of **Master of Health Leadership** students must complete a minimum of 300 Units of Credit consisting of the courses listed in Appendix B.

To be eligible for the award of **Graduate Diploma of Health Leadership** students must complete a

minimum of 200 Units of Credit including 50 Units of Credit from two 2) Elective Courses chosen from the courses listed in Appendix B.

To be eligible for the award of Graduate Certificate in Health Leadership students must complete a minimum of 100 Units of Credit consisting of the courses listed in Appendix A

6.6 Course substitutions
