3 PURPOSE

These Program Requirements set out the approved requirements for UniPath.

4 OVERVIEW

4.1 Campus Availability

UniPath has been approved for delivery on the Fremantle, Broome and Sydney campuses and its satellite sites.

UniPath Plus has been approved for delivery on the Fremantle campus only for 2025.

4.2 Student Availability

UniPath is available for enrolment to domestic year 11 and year 12 high school students.

UniPath Plus (health stream) is available to domestic year 12 high school students.

4.3 Australian Qualifications Framework

UniPath is not an AQF qualification.

4.4 Duration

4.4.1 The Volume of Learning for UniPath is one semester (12 weeks). Study is full-time. Part time study is not available.

4.4.2 The Volume of Learning for UniPath Plus (health stream) is 2 semesters (2 x 12 weeks). Study is full-time. Part time study is not available.

4.5 Maximum Duration

4.5.1 The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete UniPath is two semesters full time from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

4.5.2 The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete UniPath Plus is three semesters full time from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University. If a student is unsuccessful in passing the undergraduate course(s) in semester 2, they can repeat the course(s) in the following semester. This applies only to undergraduate courses from semester 2 of the program.

4.6 Study Mode

UniPath is offered in Internal Study mode only.

UniPath Plus is offered in internal mode only.

4.7 Professional Accreditation

There are no professional accreditation requirements applicable to this Program.

5 ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

5.1 University Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission to The University of Notre Dame Australia, all applicants must meet the [University's minimum requirements for admission](#). The requirements for admission are detailed in the University's Policy: *Admissions*.

5.2 Specific Program Requirements for Admission

To be eligible for admission to UniPath applicants must also meet the following specific requirements.

Western Australia

If you are a general pathway student, you will require:

- Minimum 4 general subjects of which one must be English
- Minimum C grade in English
- For general subjects mostly B grades (will accept a maximum of 2 C grades)
- Principal or teacher's recommendation

If you are an ATAR and General pathway student, you will require:

- Minimum of 4 subjects (can be a mix of ATAR and general) of which one must be English
- For ATAR subjects, mostly C grades (will accept 3 C grades)
- For General subjects, mostly B grades (will accept a maximum of 2 C grades)
- Principal or teacher's recommendation

To be eligible for admission to UniPath Plus (health stream) applicants must meet the above specific requirements and have completed semester 1 successfully to be able to continue into semester 2 (and enrol in undergraduate courses).

New South Wales

If you are an ATAR and General pathway student, you will require:

- Minimum of 4 HSC subjects of which one **must** be English
- Minimum C grade across all subjects
- Principal or teacher's recommendation

As this is a partnership between your School and the University of Notre Dame, your School must recommend you as eligible for the program before you apply.

6 PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

6.1 Program Description

UniPath is a pathway program that provides year 11 and year 12 students aiming for university (on a NON-ATAR pathway) a pathway to University. The program is designed to provide students with the fundamental skills and knowledge to transition competently into an undergraduate program. The program aims to develop research and academic writing skills, essential mathematics skills, and clear and effective communication skills. Students learn about being ethical scholars, academic integrity, incorporating research in their writing and writing in an academic tone. Working in teams, presenting, time management, conflict resolution, critical thinking and notetaking are just some of the skills they learn in the communication skills course. UniPath will assist students to develop an understanding of different systems of knowledge, methods of learning and strategies for success and how to become an independent learner in a university environment. Further, UniPath will provide students with the skills and confidence to undertake an undergraduate program in a higher education environment.

6.2 Program Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of UniPath graduates will be able to:

1. Demonstrate an understanding of academic, personal, and ethical requirements for university learning
2. Demonstrate effective oral, literacy and numeracy communication skills
3. Demonstrate the ability to undertake a formulated writing process, including planning, research, writing and editing
4. Identify, locate, and evaluate relevant sources of information.

5. Participate in a group or team project that demonstrate effective interpersonal and collaborative learning practices (either face to face or online)
6. Apply mathematical reasoning skills and solve practical problems in a variety of contexts
7. Demonstrate competency by communicating strategies using appropriate mathematical language when solving problems

6.3 Required Courses

6.3.1 To successfully complete UniPath students must complete a minimum of 75 Units of Credit (Course list provided in Appendix A) as well as the ENAB0100 – Learning for University course during orientation week. Learning for University is compulsory but is a non-bearing credit course.

6.3.2 To successfully complete UniPath Plus (health stream) students must successfully complete semester 1 (a minimum of 75 Units of Credit as well as the ENAB0100 – Learning for University course during orientation week. Learning for University is compulsory but is a non-bearing credit course (Course list provided in Appendix A).

In addition students will complete one or two 25 credit bearing first semester undergraduate courses (Course list provided in Appendix B).

6.4 Elective Courses

There are no elective courses in UniPath (general stream).

In UniPath (health stream) students will either enrol in ENAB0002 Essential Mathematics or ENAB0001 Communication Skills.

6.5 Course substitutions

There are no approved course substitutions permitted in this program.
